

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

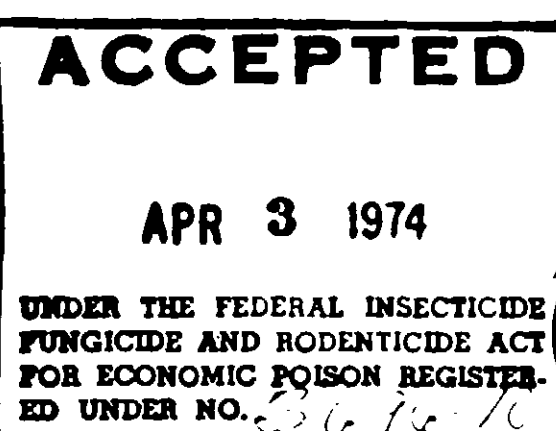
HOMES -- HOTELS -- MOTELS -- SCHOOLS

Remove heavy soil deposits prior to application of Pine Oil Disinfectant. Apply in a manner so as to thoroughly wet surfaces being treated.

REST ROOMS AND BATHROOMS: Use a few drops of Pine Oil Disinfectant to deodorize toilet bowls and urinals. Use two (2) fluid ounces to one gallon of water to clean toilet seats, lavatory, tubs and other bathroom fixtures.

KITCHENS: Use two (2) fluid ounces to one gallon of water to wash cabinets and sinks. A few drops down drain cuts grease, eliminates unpleasant odors.

GARBAGE PAILS AND OTHER WASTE RECEPTACLES: Wash using one (1) fluid ounce to one quart of water sanitizes and eliminates odors.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

DISINFECTING SICK ROOM: Use three (3) fluid ounces to one gallon of water for washing bedpans and urinals, dishes, floors, and furniture. Food contact surfaces must be rinsed in potable water prior to reuse.

Leaves a fresh pine fragrance throughout the sick room.

LAUNDRY: To boost cleaning power on heavily soiled fabrics such as greasy work clothes, add 1/2 cup to front loading washer or 1 cup to top loaders along with your regular laundry soap or detergent. Apply full strength to paint or stubborn grease spots and allow to soak until softened before washing.

CAUTION: HARMFUL IF SWALLOWED. Do not induce vomiting. Drink milk and immediately call a physician. **MAY CAUSE IRRITATION.** Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. If eye contact occurs, wash eyes immediately with water. Avoid contamination of food.

Rinse empty container thoroughly with water before discarding.
