

Use this lawn insecticide in the following manner: 1. Apply this product in a manner consistent with its labeling. 2. Use D-PSBAK® on Lawns, other Ornamentals and Recreational Turf Grass Areas and Perennial Turf Grasses 3. Apply to the Seed Zone D-PSBAK® 4E to control the pests listed in the following table by application at the recommended dosages and in accordance with the directions given below. 4. Use D-PSBAK® 4E in enough water to obtain complete and uniform coverage of the interested areas and apply as a coarse, low-pressure spray using suitable application equipment. Thoroughly wash immediately after treatment to wash the insecticide into the soil. As is noted, for best results, the lawn should be moist at time of treatment.

Abs. = weevils, Brown bugs = chiggers, chinch bugs, cutworms, crickets, caterpillars, earwigs, Fleas, Grasshoppers, Grounds, use 4-1/2 oz per 100 sq. ft. Spray when pests first appear. Extra when needed for cutworms. Delay watering for 24 hours after treatment. Use 1 gallon water per 100 sq. ft. White grubs, European spruce and Japanese beetle are only use 1/2 to 3/4 oz per 100 sq. ft. usually during late July and August. Is recommended for local Agricultural Extension Service for a list of dealers. Immediately after spraying, irrigate the treated area with 1/2 inch of water. Wash the insecticide in the underlying soil. 4-1/2 oz per 100 sq. ft. = 3.3 4-1/2 oz per 100 sq. ft. = 1/2 lb per 100 sq. ft. = 1 lb per acre

Application of a spray of insecticides and fungicides to the soil on the treated areas during application of the spray was found to be effective in controlling the insects and fungi.

NOTE Moistures in the test material are treated for uniformity and the specimens are tested with a de-aired curing medium. The rate of cement hydration depends on exposure of the surface to weathering conditions.
