(In home gardens use 10 ounces per 150 feet of row, more or less depending on size of plants). DO NOT TREAT LEAF LETTUCE WITHIN 14 DAYS OF HARVEST. Apply to silks as soon as they appear. Make 3 or 4 applications at 2-3 day intervals as infestation warrants. Re-apply immediately after rain.

POTATOES, TOMATOES, and PEPPERS-For control of COLORADO POTATO BEETLES, LEARHO FLEA BEETLES dust in a manner to thoroughly cover upper and lower leaf surfaces GRAPES—For control of JAPANESE BEETLES start dusting when first beetles appear.
