4. Delete the emesis statement directing the accident victim to drink warm salty water. Use the following:

Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

After first aid is given (see First Aid Treatment Section) and if a doctor takes victim to clinic or hospital. **IMPORTANT!** Before removing gloves, wash them with soap and water. Wash hands, face and arms with soap and water before smoking, eating or drinking. **AFTER WORK,** take off all work clothes and shoes. Shower, using hot water. Wear only clean clothes when leaving job. Do not wear treated clothing. Wash protective clothing and protective equipment with soap and water after each use. Respirator should be cleaned and filter replaced according to instructions included with respirator.

POISON SIGNS (Symptoms)

Parathion is a very dangerous poison. It rapidly enters the body through skin surfaces and eyes. Clothing wet with this material must be changed immediately. Exposed persons must receive prompt medical treatment. Some of the signs and symptoms of poisoning are: Headache, nausea, vomiting, weakness, blurred vision, pin-point pupils, tightness in chest, difficulty breathing, nervousness, sweating, watering of eyes, drooping of eyelids and nose, muscle spasms and coma.

FIRST AID TREATMENT

Call a doctor (physician) clinic or hospital immediately. Explain that you have been exposed to parathion and describe his condition. If breathing is stopped, start artificial respiration immediately and maintain until doctor sees victim. If swallowed and victim is awake (conscious) make him quickly ingest vomiting by forcing frogged down throat or by giving strong salty water to drink. Repeat until vomit is clear. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Have victim lie down and keep quiet. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. See also...

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Antidote-atropine atropine sulfate in large doses. TWO TO FOUR mg may be given orally or intravenously as soon as cyanosis is overcome. Repeat at 5 to 10 minute intervals until signs of a tropinization appear. PAM chloride is also antidote and may be administered in conjunction with atropine. **DO NOT GIVE METHIPHA (SPANQUILER).** Parathion is a strong cholinesterase inhibitor affecting central and peripheral nervous systems and producing cardiac and respiratory depression. All signs of pulmonary edema (the patient should be given supplementary oxygen and treated symptomatically). Continued absorption of the poison may occur and this may have been reported after initial improvement. **CLOSE SUPERVISION OF THE PATIENT IS INDICATED FOR AT LEAST 48 HOURS. TREAT SYMPTOMATICALLY.** Toxaphene produces central nervous system excitation which ordinarily responds to barbituric acid derivatives, but drug should be administered only if complete atropinization fails to relieve symptoms.
