The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, will be acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling.

1. The product name change is acceptable.
2. Revise your Container Disposal statement to read "Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill or incineration, or if allowed by state and local authorities by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke."
3. The Agency has noted that you removed the Environmental Hazards section from the proposed label. Since this product is intended for use other than homeowner and the potential use does not exclude outdoor use, you must add back the Environmental Hazards statement or add a statement that limits this product to "Indoor Use Only."


A stamped copy of the labeling is enclosed for your records. Submit one (1) copy of the final printed label prior to release of the product for shipment.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

This carpet sanitizing concentrate should be an integral part of any carpet maintenance system. Routine application will not only clean the carpets, but sanitize and deodorize for a cleaner, longer lasting carpet. It is a low foaming carpet shampoo formulated for use with extraction and carpet steam cleaning equipment. It contains "twin chain" quaternary ammonium compounds to reduce the growth of odor causing bacteria.

It is fortified with odor counteractants to neutralize malodors. Optimized for use on washable synthetic fibers, but not recommended for use on wool carpets. It effectively and economically lifts and removes greasy soil, resists resoiling and utilizes "built-in" defoamers for more productive use. It leaves no residue to promote resoiling and eliminates soil redeposition to vacuum pickup tanks.

TO CLEAN, SANITIZE AND DEODORIZE CARPETS.

STEAM EXTRACTION: Vacuum carpet thoroughly. Mix two (2) ounces of carpet sanitizing concentrate per gallon of water. Inject and extract as you would any other steam cleaning shampoo.

EXTRACTION: Vacuum carpet thoroughly. Mix two (2) ounces of carpet sanitizing

concentrate per gallon of water. Prespray onto the carpet at a rate of 1/3 - 1/2 gallon per 100 ft. and extract as you would other extraction cleaning shampoos.

SPIN BONNET (BONNET BUFF) CLEANING: Vacuum carpet thoroughly. Mix four (4) ounces of carpet sanitizing concentrate per gallon of water. Bonnet on carpet at rate of 200-300 sq. ft. per gallon.

BONNET CLEANING: Vacuum carpet thoroughly. Mix four (4) ounces of carpet sanitizing concentrate per gallon of water. Spray on carpet at a rate of 200-300 sq. ft. per gallon.

HEAVY DUTY SPIN BONNET (BONNET BUFF) CLEANING: Vacuum carpet thoroughly. Mix sixteen (16) ounces of carpet sanitizing concentrate per gallon of water. Spray on carpet at rate of 200-300 sq. ft. per gallon.

NOTE: Test colorfastness of carpet before use. Apply diluted cleaner to a small concealed spot, then rub with clean white cloth. If color transfers to cloth or changes, a water base product should not be used.

NOTE: Not recommended for use on stain-resistant nylon carpets. Consult carpet manufacturer's warranty and maintenance instructions for proper use.

After cleaning, set carpet pile in one direction with a stiff brush (carpet pilator). Place aluminum foil under legs of furniture while carpet is drying. Over-wetting can cause shrinking of carpet. Manufacturer assumes no responsibility for over-wetting or misuse.

PRECAUTIONS HAZARDS TO HUMANS

DANGER. KEEP OUT OF THE REACH OF CHILDREN. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, or clothing. Wear rubber gloves when handling.
