On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby registered/reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act.

Registration is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or recommendation of this product by the Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This action is taken under the authority of section 4(g)(2)(c) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended. Reregistration under this section does not eliminate the need for continual reassessment of pesticides. EPA may require submission of data at any time to maintain the registration of your product.

Based on your response to the Reregistration Eligibility Document(s), EPA has reregistered the product listed above provided that the following change is made to the label:

1. Revise the Ingredient Statement from:

Note: The Agency in 2003 determined that the technical name of N,N-Diethyl-meta-toluamide and other isomers, may be expressed simply as DEET. Therefore, you may also remove the footnote mark and associated footnote from the ingredient statement if ABC Compounding wants as an amendment.

- 2. Within the First Aid Section of the label, remove the following subsection within the table:

IF YOU SUSPECT A REACTION TO THIS PRODUCT:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Immediate use. • Take off contaminated clothing. • Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. • Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.
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PR Notice 2001-1 does not provide for any alternative language to be inserted within the "If on Skin or Clothing" subsection. This text is also duplicated within the Directions for Use (shown in section 4 below).

- 3. Remove "Volume 8 FL OZ" from the label. *Pressurized Products (includes gases and aerosols). The net contents must be expressed as avoirdupois pounds and ounces. 40 CFR 156.10(d).*

- 4. Within the Directions for Use section, revise as follows:
 "It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with ~~the~~ its labeling.

READ AND FOLLOW ALL DIRECTIONS AND PRECAUTIONS ON THIS PRODUCT LABEL.

For Outdoor Use Only. Do not spray in enclosed areas. Never use repellents over cuts, wounds, sunburned or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth, and apply sparingly around ears. Do not allow children to handle this product, and do not apply to children's hands. When using on children, apply to your own hands and then put it on the child. Apply only to exposed skin and/or clothing (as directed on the product label). Do not use under clothing. Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin. Heavy application and saturation is unnecessary for effectiveness; if biting insects do not respond to a thin film of repellent, apply a bit more. After returning indoors, wash treated skin with soap and water or bathe. This is particularly important when repellents are used repeatedly in a day or on consecutive days. Also, wash treated clothing before wearing it again. **Use of this product may cause skin reactions in rare cases. If you suspect a reaction to this product, discontinue use, wash treated skin, and call your local poison control center. If you go to a doctor, take this product with you.**

For application to exposed skin to repel mosquitoes, biting flies, gnats, and fleas: Hold unit 4-6 inches from the skin of arms or legs while applying with a slow sweeping motion, until surface is slightly moistened. Rub with hand to insure an even distribution. To apply to face and neck, spray in palm of hand in short bursts and spread on the skin sparingly avoiding eyes.

For application to outer surfaces of clothing to repel mosquitoes, biting flies, chiggers, fleas, and ticks: Spray outer surfaces of clothing, especially socks, shoe tops, pant legs, and waistband.

Do not apply to synthetic fabrics such as acetate, rayon or spandex. May damage furniture finishes, leather, plastics, painted and varnished surfaces including watch crystals, and automobiles."

- 5. Revise the Storage and Disposal Section as follows:
"Storage and Disposal
Do Not Puncture or Incinerate!
Pesticide Storage: Store in a cool dry place away from heat or open flame and inaccessible to children.

Pesticide Disposal: If empty: Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. **If partly filled:** Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions.

- 6. To be eligible for reregistration, aerosol and pump spray formulations must be packaged in containers utilizing a concave trigger to help aim product or other comparable mechanism that will ensure that the product will not be inadvertently sprayed in the eyes.
- 7. The Agency is in the process of developing and improving the current Efficacy Assessment Guidelines for repellent products. The Agency intends to defer the determination of any related efficacy data requirements supporting the claims that may appear on this label until these Efficacy Assessment Guidelines are complete. When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.

Do not apply over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth, apply sparingly around ears. Do not apply to children's hands. Do not allow children to handle this product. When using on children, apply to your own hands and then put it on the child. **DO NOT SPRAY DIRECTLY ON FACE.** Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Do not use under clothing. Avoid over-application of this product. Frequent reapplication and saturation is unnecessary for effectiveness. After returning indoors, wash treated skin with soap and water. Wash treated clothing before wearing it again. Use of this product may cause skin reactions in rare cases. If you suspect that you or your child is reacting to this product, discontinue use, wash treated skin and call your local poison control center. If you go to a doctor, take this repellent with you. For protection against mosquitoes and biting flies, pay special attention to where biting through clothes occurs - shoulders, elbows, seat of trousers, front of trousers, front of thighs, inner, and socks. For protection against chiggers (mites), fleas, and ticks, pay special attention to the necks, shoe tops, and fly, trouser leg cuffs, trouser fly, and waistband, and the front fly and cuff fly of the shirt. Avoid contact with plastics, such as sunglasses frames, and such fabric as acetate rayon. Do not spray in enclosed areas.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL
