The following amendment, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with comments.

Proposed Amendment

• Revised Labeling per EPA letter dated May 21, 2010 – Delete "Once-Through Cooling Tower"

Conditions

Revise the label as follows:

1) Revise the "Precautionary Statements" to be in agreement with the December 3, 2008 Product Re-registration acute toxicology evaluation by stating:

Corrosive. Causes irreversible eye damage. Harmful if inhaled, swallowed, or absorbed through the skin. Do not get in eyes. Avoid contact with skin or clothing or breathing vapor. Wear protective eyewear (goggles or face shield). Prolonged or frequently repeated skin contact may cause allergic reactions in some individuals. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, or using tobacco. Remove contaminated clothing and wash separately before reuse.

2.) The "User Safety Recommendations" section must be brought into compliance with PR Notice 2000-5, Mandatory Language by deleting the term, recommendations and stating "*requirements*." Also, replace the term, should, with "*must*."

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3.) The "Directions for Use" must be brought into compliance with PR Notice 2000-5, Mandatory labeling, by deleting the term, should, and stating "*must*."
