Directions

Remove metal cap. Press down plastic button with hole away from you. Hold container 6 to 12 inches from animal. Start spraying at the tail, moving up to the back of the neck. Cover the legs and underbody of the animal. On long haired animals fluff the hair as the spray is applied to allow the spray to penetrate to the skin. Spray until the entire coat is slightly damp. Spray any ticks directly. Avoid spraying eyes, face, or scrotum. Repeat when necessary, but not more often than each seven days. Treat bedding, kennel, and quarters of animal also to prevent reinfestation of the pet.

CAUTION: Do not spray near eyes. In case of contact flush eyes liberally with water for a few minutes. Get medical attention if required. Avoid contamination of food or food-stuffs. Wash hand after applying. Contents under pressure. Do not puncture or incinerate can. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Exposure to temperatures above 120 degrees Fahrenheit may cause the can to burst. Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. Avoid prolonged or repeated contact with skin.

CAUTION: Do not treat kittens or puppies less than four weeks of age.
