Do not apply directly to food. In commercial food handling facilities, cover or remove any food and food processing equipment during application. Do not apply while food processing is under way. For control of institutional and industrial insects in institutions, food processing plants, restaurants, food handling establishments, industry, schools, motels & hotels

Flies, Mosquitoes, Gnats and Flying Moll
 Direct spray at insects, using short bursts (1 to 2 seconds) or broad unoccupied areas as follows: Close doors and windows. With a sweeping motion, direct spray upward to all parts of the room (1 to 10 seconds per 1000 cubic feet). Keep room clear for 15 minutes. Do not remain in treated area. Ventilate area after treatment is completed.

Wasps and Hornets: Direct spray at these insects using short bursts. Spray thoroughly into nests, hiding and breeding places when insects have settled at night.

Ants: Spray trails, nests and points of entry. Spray ants where possible. Repeat as necessary.

Beaches, Sawbugs, Bedbug Bugs, Centipedes, Earwigs, Crickets, Grasshoppers and Spiders: Spray thoroughly into hiding places such as cracks, crevices, moist areas, openings around pipes and sinks, under refrigerators, baseboards and storage areas. Spray directly on insects where possible. Repeat as necessary.

FOR CONTROL OF PESTS ON ORNAMENTAL PLANTS: For control of aphids, two-spotted spider mites, and adult white flies on ornamental house and greenhouse plants (African violets, arums, Christmas cacti, chrysanthemums, gloriosa lilies, geraniums, fuchsias, gloxinias, ivy, lantanas, Mealy bella palms, pelargoniums, roses and snapdragons); on evergreen plants (azaleas, chrysanthemums, eucalyptus, ivy, marigolds, petunias, roses, snapdragons and sunnies). Spray plants with a slow sweeping motion so that insect drifts into plant. Direct spray so that upper and lower leaf surfaces are contacted. Use caution on new growth and tender foliage. Repeat as necessary. When using outdoors, spray when dry to sun.
