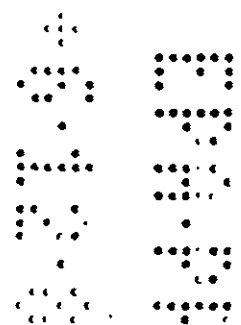

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Storage: Store in a cool area away from heat or open flame.

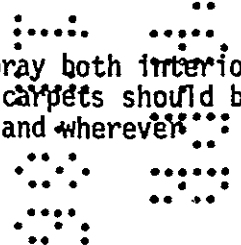
Disposal: Do not reuse empty container. Wrap container and put in trash collection.

SHAKE BEFORE USE. HOLD CONTAINER UPRIGHT. APPLY IN SHORT BURSTS.

To Kill Flies, Mosquitoes, Small Flying Moths, Gnats and Wasps: Close all doors and windows and direct spray upward into center of room with a slow sweeping motion. Spray 5-10 seconds for average room. Keep room closed for 15 minutes after spraying. Ventilate room thoroughly before re-entry. Sweep up and destroy fallen insects. Before spraying cover exposed food and utensils.

To Kill Cockroaches, Ants and Crickets: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray in addition to thorough spraying of all parts of the room suspected of harboring these pests. Special attention should be paid to cracks, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators, food storage areas and wherever these pests are suspected of hiding. To kill ants, treat doors, around window frames, ant trails and other areas of entry. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Carpet Beetles: Directly spray as many insects as possible. Spray both interior and exterior of upholstered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs and carpets should be sprayed thoroughly. Also treat shelves, closets, areas under furniture and wherever these insects are seen or suspected. Repeat as necessary.



To Kill Exposed Forms of Confused Flour Beetles, Saw-toothed Grain Beetles, and Rice Weevils: Find and destroy infested package goods. Remove all other items from pantry. Spray the shelves to kill any of the named insects present. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after shelves have dried. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Sowbugs, Centipedes, Firebrats and Spiders: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray. Also thoroughly spray all parts of the room suspected of harboring these pests. Special attention should be paid to cracks, crevices, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators.

To Kill Fleas and Ticks on Dogs and Cats: Apply directly to animal's back, under forelegs, and other areas except scrotum and anus. Part hair to contact skin and insure good coverage. Hold nozzle about one foot away while spraying. Apply until hair is thoroughly moist. Do not spray directly in eyes or mouth of animal. Repeat within 24 hours of first treatment, if necessary. Note: This aerosol may make a slight hissing sound and cause a temporary cool sensation. Hold pet securely while applying. Nervous animals may become frightened the first time this product is used, but soon become accustomed to the treatment.

To Kill Fleas and Ticks in Pet Bedding and Pet Areas: To reduce reinfestation, thoroughly spray the animal's bedding and other resting places until the surface is slightly moist. Treat these areas at the rate of two seconds per linear foot at a distance of 12 to 18 inches. Also spray the entire inside surface of dog houses. Repeat as necessary.

To Treat Flea and Tick Infestation in Rugs and Carpets: Spray rugs and carpets where fleas tend to hide. If used on light or delicate upholstery fabrics, test for potential staining in an inconspicuous place prior to use. Spray thoroughly into hiding places such as cracks and crevices, in walls and floors, along baseboards, window and door frames. Repeat as necessary.
