The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with the Label Improvement Program Notice for Antimicrobial Products Used as Food Contact Surface Sanitizers, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. Delete the word "milk."
2. Revise the "Directions" heading to read "Directions For Use."
3. In the Note To Physician section, delete the statement "Measures against circulatory shock, respiratory depression, and convulsions may be needed."
4. On the right side panel, place the statement "Keep Out of Reach of Children" above the signal word "Danger."

5. Revise the Environmental Hazards statement to read as follows:

Environmental Hazards

Do not discharge effluent containing this product to sewer systems without previously notifying the sewage treatment plant authority. DIRECTIONS

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. To sanitize inside the premises, walls and floors in food plants, restaurants, hotels, schools, hospitals and public places.

1. All soiled surfaces must be cleaned first with a good detergent, followed by a clear rinse.
2. Apply proper use solution onto surfaces, using spray or brush, and let the article to be treated

3. Allow use solution to remain on surface for a minimum of 10 minutes contact time for disinfecting and 2 minutes for sanitizing.
4. Drain the use solution from the surface and air dry.
5. Fresh sanitizing solution must be prepared at least daily or more often if the solution becomes diluted or soiled.

For Mold & Mildew Control on tile & painted surfaces, use 3 oz. CHEMPROCIDe per gallon of water.

1. Clean surface prior to application.
