Mixing Instructions:

Fill tank partially with water, then add required amount of concentrate slowly while filling tank to desired volume, and mix thoroughly for at least five minutes. Prior addition of a small quantity of silicone antifoam to the water will prevent excessive foam.

Rate of Application:

Use one gallon of concentrate to make 250 gallons of water emulsion having a treating concentration of 2700 ppm ETHOXYQUIN.

Temperature of Application:

Control of storage scald is best when fruit is still warm at time of application and the treating bath is maintained at 65-75° F (18-24° C). Efficacy diminishes appreciably at lower temperatures, and especially with cold fruit. Higher temperatures may leave excessive residue and may cause injury to fruit.

Methods of Application:

Fruit may be treated by dipping, brushing, spraying or flooding. Fruit must be substantially dry when treated to avoid dilution of the bath and diminished effectiveness.

Dipping: Immerse all fruit completely in the emulsion for about ½ to 2 or 3 minutes. Be sure at all bubbles are displaced and all fruit is thoroughly wetted. Remove and tilt bins sharply to drain thoroughly, then place in cold storage.

Spraying and Flooding: Spray or flood fruits that they are all completely wetted with the treatment of the treatment any longer than necessary for complete wetting of fruit, preferably for not more than about 2 to 3 minutes, to avoid over-treatment and possible injury.

Timing:

Treat fruit just as soon as possible after picking for best control of scald, and not later than 5-6 days after harvest, or effectiveness may be greatly diminished.



Exposure of concentrate and of the dilute emulsion to light and air causes darkening. Such darkening does not reduce effectiveness of product. Close partially full containers tightly.

Do not re-use empty container. Wash thoroughly with water and detergent, and discard in a safe place.
