## DIRECTIONS—READ PRECAUTIONS BEFORE USING

Cotton Insect Con. I-For control of boll weevils, cotton aphids, cotton leafworms and spider mates, apply 1/2 pint to I pint per acre of Methyl Parathion E-4 in indicated amount of water depending upon type of equipment and sixe of cotton. Methyl Parathion E-4 may be applied by either ground equipment or aircraft. For ground equipment, dilute in sufficient water to give adequate coverage, usually 3 to 10 gallons per acre depending on the number of nozzles per row and spray equipment. For aerial applications, dilute in 3 to 4 gallons of water per acre.

Methyl Parathion E-4 should be applied when first signs of insects appear and continued at 5 to 7 day intervals until insects are under control. However, because local conditions and plant size largely determine the rate, frequency, and effectiveness of applications, it is recommended that Federal or State agricultural authorities be consulted for specific uses.

ANTIDOTES: If swallowed—Give a tablespoonful of salt in a glass of warm water and repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Have victim lie down and keep quiet. Call a physician immediately.

TREATMENT: Give atropine, preferably by injection, grains 1/100 two or three tablets at once and parenterally or orally every hour as required up to 30 tablets or until pupils dilate. Never give morphine. Clear chest by postural drainage. Artificial respiration or oxygen administration may be necessary. Observe patient continuously 48 hours. Repeated exposure to cholinesterase inhibitors may, without warning, cause prolonged susceptibility to very small doses of any cholinesterase inhibitor. Allow no further exposure until time for cholinesterase regeneration has been allowed as determined by blood tests.

### DESTROY CONTAINER WHEN EMPTY
