**PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

CAUTION: Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling and before eating or smoking.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If On Skin: Wash thoroughly with soap and water.
If In Eyes: Flush with plenty of water.

Route to Hospital: Product contains a cholinesterase inhibitor. Atropine sulfate by injection is indicated only if symptoms of cholinesterase inhibition appear.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS: This pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS: Do not use or store near heat or open flame.

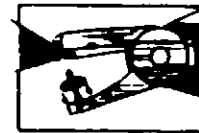

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Attach one tag per animal in the spring for control of horn flies and as an aid in the control of horn flies which are suspected of becoming resistant to pyrethroids for a full summer season. Tags are easy to apply or replace if necessary. Attach two tags per animal to control face flies, gull coast ticks, spruce ear ticks and as an aid in the control of lice, stable flies, and houseflies. EAR FORCE RANGER TAGS are easy to attach using a variety of methods. They may be punched through an existing ear tag using the ALLFLEX tagging system. See diagram on reverse. However, tags punched through adult used identification tags on young calves may result in tearing the ear and loss of the tags. Tags may also be positioned across an artery where animals are forced to use them as they gain access to barns, feeders, waterers or milking areas. Calves and cows may rub tags by sucking and chewing.

METHOD OF APPLICATION



STEP 1
 Open ear tag under tag by compressing lower collar on tag until it snaps up. Snap will button on ear. Tag will not snap on tag and button are now ready for application.



STEP 2
 Put ear tag on the ear surface at center of ear. Be sure other end of the collar button is positioned over cartilage rib or blood vessel.

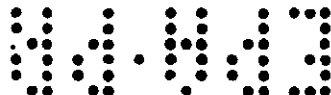
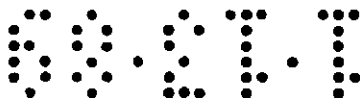
When properly attached the tag should hang as shown.
