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STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If Swallowed: Call a physician or Poison
Control Center immediately. Do

If on Skin: Remove contaminated clothing and
wash affected areas with soap
and water.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

If signs of cholinesterase inhibition are pre-
sent, atropine is antidotal. 2-PAM is also
antidotal and may be administered in conjunc-
tion with atropine. Do not administer seda-
tives for respiration. Petroleum distillate
poses aspiration hazards.
