Subject: Amendment - Status Change of Ammonium Fluosilicate from
Active to Inert
Drione 79700 Insecticide
EPA Registration No. 4816-255
Your Application Dated November 27, 1991

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes indicated below prior to release for shipment of product bearing the amended labeling.

- 1. Under the heading **Directions For Use** add the following statement:

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

- 2. The words **ACTIVE INGREDIENTS** and **INERT INGREDIENTS** must be aligned to the same margin.
- 3. The sites of application should be give more prominence on the front label panel, i.e.,

For Use in Homes, Kennels, and Non-Food Areas of Restaurants, Stores, Hotels, Offices, Plants and Warehouses.

- 4. Add these precautions to the **Directions for Use** :

Do not use in food/feed areas of food/feed handling establishments, restaurants or other areas where food/feed is commercially prepared or processed. Do not use in serving areas while food is ~~being prepared~~ facility is in operation. Serving areas are areas where

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prepared foods are served such as dining rooms but excluding areas where foods may be prepared or held.

In the home, cover all food handling surfaces and cover or remove all food and cooking utensils, or wash thoroughly after treatment.

Non-food/feed areas of food/feed areas are areas such as garbage rooms, lavatories, floor drains (to sewers entries and vestibules), offices, locker rooms, machine rooms, boiler rooms, garages, mop closets and storage (after canning or bottling).

- 5. Use in food handling establishments can imply use in the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Meat and Poultry Plants. Therefore, either add the statement "Not for Use in USDA Meat and Poultry Plants" or submit an application to USDA requesting these areas. If granted you can then indicate on the label that the product can be used in these areas.
- 6. Change the phrase USDA REG. NO. 4816-255 to EPA REG. NO. 4816-255.
- 7. Delete the word relatively from the phrase "relatively odorless".
- 8. Add the following section to the labeling:

Precautionary Statements

Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals

CAUTION: Humans: Avoid prolonged breathing of powder or contact with skin. Wash hands after using. Avoid contamination of feed or foodstuffs. **Animals:** Do not treat puppies or kitten less than four weeks of age. Do not apply directly to genitalia. Avoid exposure of pets eyes to this product.

- 9. A Storage and Disposal Statement must be added to the labeling in accordance to PR Notice 83-3.
- 10. Add the following **Environmental Hazards** section:

This product is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water. Do no contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters.

11. Add the following section to the labeling:

Statement of Practical Treatment

- IF SWALLOWED** - Contact a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink a glass of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
- IF INHALED** - Remove affected person to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.
- IF IN EYES** - Flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.
- IF ON SKIN** - Remove contaminated clothing and wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

Submit five copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. A stamped copy of the labeling is enclosed for your records.

Under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, for the registration under EPA

USDA REG. NO. 4816-255

This product is a finely divided powder which combines the flushing and killing powers of pyrethrins and piperonyl butoxide with the dehydrative principle of thermally attrited hydrogel. It is relatively odorless and non-staining and may be used in accordance with directions in homes, restaurants, stores, hotels, offices, plants and warehouses. When used as directed, it is highly effective in controlling such insects as ants, roaches, silverfish, bed bugs, fleas, lice, ticks and dry wood termites.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

To control such running and crawling insect life as ants, cockroaches, silverfish, and fleas in animal quarters, distribute Drione at the rate of 2 ounces per 100 square feet of surface area. Apply a continuous visible film underneath and behind stoves, refrigerators and appliances. Treat on, around and behind moulding, shelving, baseboards, pipe openings, cracks, crevices and other areas where insects may hide. For severe infestations apply Drione behind cabinets and walls, in crawl spaces and attics, at the rate of 16 ounces per 1000 square feet of surface area. Repeat treatment as necessary.

SEWER TREATMENTS

American and Oriental cockroach infestations in sanitary sewers may be treated with approximately 0.3 lb. Drione per manhole. When treating sewers, one manhole per 200 feet of line should be treated. Treatments are made by removing the manhole cover and replacing with a disc of plywood bored to receive the usual flexible hose from portable or truck-mounted ventilating equipment. A one pound coffee can will hold about 0.2 lb. of Drione. This amount is introduced into the ventilating air, to be dispersed quickly and thoroughly through the system.
