Cherries: Cherry Fruit Fly

3. On Page 2 of your use directions, add a heading, "Mixing Directions", before your text on this subject ("Fill the ... applying spray.)
4. On Page 3 of your use directions, add a heading, "Application Directions" before your text on this subject ("Cherry Fruit Fly ... of harvest.")


You have 18 months to begin using this revised labeling.

This pesticide is extremely toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present, or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Runoff and drift from treated areas may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in adjacent sites. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters.

STORAGE & DISPOSAL

AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), and restricted entry interval. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standard.

Do not enter or allow worker entry into treated areas during the restricted entry interval (REI) of 12 hours.

PPE required for early entry to treated areas that is permitted under the Worker Protection Standard and that involves contact with anything that has been treated, such as plants, soil, or water, is:

- Coveralls
- Waterproof gloves
- Shoes plus socks

Fill the spray tank two-thirds full of water, start agitator running. slowly sift directly into the water the required amount of this material (do not wash through screen). Add the required amount of oil and finish filling tank with water. Let mixing continue in the tank for 5 minutes or until completely mixed, before applying spray.

CHERRY FRUIT FLY: Cherry Fruit Fly on Cherries - Use at the rate of 3 pounds per 100 gallons of water in full coverage applications (apply a minimum of 300 gallons but not over 650 gallons per acre). Spray at 10 day intervals beginning with emergence of flies continuing until harvest. Do not apply within 1 day of harvest.

BLACK SCALE: Black Scale on Oranges, Lemons and Grapefruit - Use 8 to 12 pounds and 12 to 16 gallons of Light Medium Soluble Oil or Light Medium Emulsion Oil in 500 gallons of water per acre by ground sprayer. Treat after completion of hatch - August through October. Do not apply within 1 day of harvest.

CITRUS APHIDS: Citrus Aphids on Oranges, Lemons, and Grapefruit - Use 5 to 8 pounds and 5 to 10 gallons of Light Medium Soluble Oil or Light Medium Emulsion Oil in 500 gallons of water per acre by ground sprayer. Apply when Aphids appear and repeat as required. Do not apply within 1 day of harvest.
