The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable subject to the comments listed below:

1. Add the sentence "Harmful if inhaled." to the beginning of the Precautionary Statements.
2. Revise the second paragraph of the Precautionary Statement to read as follows:

"Foods should be removed or covered during treatment. All food processing surfaces should be covered during treatment of thoroughly cleaned with an effective cleanser followed by a rinse with potable water before reuse. When using the product in these areas, apply only when the facility is not in operation."

Move this paragraph to the Directions for Use.

A stamped copy is enclosed for your records.

The confidential statements of formula referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, are acceptable. The confidential statement of formula for the basic formulation (dated October 25, 1995) supersedes all previously-accepted confidential statements of formula for the basic formulation. The confidential statement of formula for an alternate formulation (dated October 25, 1995) is also acceptable and has been added to the product file.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazards to Humans & Domestic Animals

CAUTION. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or spray mist. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse. Do not smoke while spraying.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Storage and Disposal

Store in a cool, dry area. Do not store or transport below 32°F.

Container Disposal: Wrap container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

FLYING INSECTS (Flies, Mosquitoes, Gnats): Direct spray at insects using short bursts (1 to 2 seconds) or treat unoccupied areas as follows: Close doors and windows. With a sweeping motion, direct spray upward so that the room is filled with mist (8 to 10 seconds per 1000 cubic feet). Keep room closed for 15 minutes and ventilate before reoccupying. Do not remain in treated areas.

CRAWLING PESTS (Ants, Crickets, and Sowbugs): Direct spray to contact pests when possible by spraying into cracks of woodwork, walls, floors and other hiding and breeding places.

WASPS and HORNETS: Direct spray at these insects using short bursts. After insects have settled at night, spray thoroughly into nests, hiding and breeding places.
