Subject: Revised Labeling and Confidential Statements of Formula
Tetralate General Purpose 0.25-0.25 Insect Killer
EPA Registration Number 4816-503
Submissions Dated November 29, 1995

The confidential statements of formula referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, are acceptable. The confidential statement of formula for the basic formulation (dated October 25, 1995) supersedes all previously-approved confidential statements of formula for the basic formulation. The confidential statement of formula for an alternate formulation (dated October 25, 1995) has been added to the file for this product.

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable subject to the comments listed below:

1. Delete the word "new" from the claim "Contains a Combination of Two New Highly Active Sythetic Pyrethroid Compounds." Both active ingredients have been registered for quite some time and, therefore, the term "new" is not appropriate.
2. Correct the spelling of the word "Sythetic" to read "Synthetic" in that same marketing claim.
3. Add the following statement to the Statement of Practical Treatment:

IF SWALLOWED: Call a doctor or get medical attention. Do not induce vomiting. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Avoid alcohol.

4. Revise the first paragraph of the Precautionary Statements to read as follows:

"CAUTION. Harmful if swallowed. Causes eye irritation. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or spray mist. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse."

5. Move the second paragraph of the Precautionary Statements to the Directions for Use.
6. Delete the sentence "Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters." from the Environmental Hazards statement. This sentence is not appropriate since this product is an aerosol.
7. Correct the spelling of the word "emoving" to read "removing" in the Directions for Use "TO KILL EXPOSED STAGES OF:" section.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records. Submit three copies of revised final printed labeling prior to releasing product for shipment.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazards to Humans & Domestic Animals

CAUTION. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or spray mist. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse.

Foods should be removed or covered during treatment. All food processing surfaces should be covered during treatment and thoroughly cleaned with an effective cleaning compound followed by a potable rinse before reuse. When using the product in these areas, apply only when the facility is not in operation.

Remove pets, birds, and cover fish aquaria before spraying.

Do not smoke while spraying.

Environmental Hazards

This product is extremely toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water. Runoff and drift from treated areas may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in adjacent sites. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters.

Physical or Chemical Hazards

Contents under pressure. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130°F may cause bursting.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Storage and Disposal

Store in a cool, dry area. Do not store or transport below 32°F.

Container Disposal: Wrap container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

SHAKE BEFORE USE: Point valve away from face and press button. Hold can at least 3 feet from surfaces which may stain and 18 inches from plants.

FOR CONTROL OF RESIDUAL AND INDUSTRIAL INSECTS. Flies, Mosquitoes, Gnats and Moths:

Direct spray at insects using short bursts (1-2 seconds) or treat unoccupied areas as follows: Close doors and windows. With a sweeping motion, direct spray upward to all parts of the room (8 to 10 seconds per 1000 cubic feet). Keep room closed for 15 minutes and ventilate before reoccupying. Do not remain in treated areas. Ventilate area after treatment is completed.

WASPS And HORNETS: Direct spray at these insects using short bursts. Spray thoroughly into nests, hiding and breeding places when insects have settled at night.

Ants: Spray hills, nests and points of entry. Spray on
Ants where possible. Repeat as necessary.

Carpet Beetles: Directly spray as many insects as possible. Spray both interior and exterior of upholstered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs should be sprayed thoroughly. Also treat shelves, closets, areas under furniture and anywhere these insects are seen or suspected. Repeat as necessary.

Fleas: Remove and destroy pet's old bedding. Spray sleeping quarters of pets, around baseboards, window and door frames, wall cracks and local areas of floors. Repeat as necessary. Do not spray animals. Put fresh bedding in pets quarters after spray has dried. Also treat dogs and cats with a registered flea control product before allowing them to enter treated area.

Cockroaches, Sowbugs, Boxelder Bugs, Silverfish, Firebrats, Earwigs, Crickets, Grain Mites and Silverfish: Spray thoroughly into hiding places such as cracks, crevices, moist areas, openings around pipes and sinks, under refrigerators, baseboards and storage areas. Spray directly on insects where possible. Repeat as necessary.

TO KILL EXPOSED STAGES OF: Confused Flour Beetles, Flat Grain Beetles, Larder Beetles, Red Flour Beetles, Sawtoothed Grain Beetles, Spider Beetles, Angoumois Grain Moths, Indianmeal Moths, Mediterranean Flour Moths, Tobacco Moths, Granary Weevils, Rice Weevils, Lesser Mealworms, Meal Worms, Cadellies, Cheesemites, Cheese Skippers, Cigarette Beetles and Shiny Spider Beetles: Remove infested grain, cereal or flour and destroy. Avoid contamination of other food and food stuffs in the area by removing before spraying. Apply spray directly on exposed stages of the listed grain pests and into cracks and crevices where they may be hiding.

FOR CONTROL OF PESTS ON ORNAMENTAL PLANTS: Aphids, Two-Spotted Spider Mites And Adult Whiteflies on ornamental house and greenhouse plants (African violets, aralias, Christmas cherries, chrysanthemums, cinerarias, diffenbachias, fuschias, gloxinias, ivy, lantanas, Neathe bella palms, petunias, roses and snapdragons); and on outdoor plants (azaleas, chrysanthemums, euonymus, ivy, marigolds, petunias, roses, snapdragons and zinnias). Spray plants with a slow sweeping motion so that mist drifts into plants. Direct spray so that upper and lower leaf surfaces are contacted. Use caution on new growth and tender foliage. Repeat as necessary. When using outdoors, spray when air is still.
