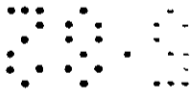

## DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use  
this product in a manner inconsistent with  
its labeling.

Shake can well before using.

This insecticide may be used outdoors in  
gardens or in greenhouses throughout the  
growing season or as a pre-harvest treat-  
ment when other insecticides are prohibited  
due to residue restrictions and use  
limitations.

For best results, use throughout the grow-  
ing season to prevent buildups of insect  
infestations. Spray plants from a distance  
of 1½ to 2 feet using short bursts of 1  
second. To prevent injury to plants, avoid  
visibly wetting the foliage.

Apply in the early morning or late evening  
when the air is still, treating all foliage  
with particular attention to the undersides  
of leaves. Contact insects directly when-  
ever possible. Repeat treatment every 7-10  
days or as reinfestation occurs.

USE ON ORNAMENTALS: African violets, as-  
ters, azaleas, begonias, camellias, carna-  
tions, chrysanthemums, dahlias, dogwood,  
geraniums, gladioli, marigolds, roses, rub-  
ber plants, and wandering Jew

TO CONTROL: Aphids, flea beetles, leaf-  
hopper, whiteflies, gypsy moth caterpillars,  
and adult tent caterpillars, and adult  
Japanese beetle

USE ON: asparagus, beans, broccoli, cab-  
bage, brussels sprouts, cauliflower, celery,  
cranberries, cucumbers, melons, squash,  
eggplants, lettuce, mustard greens, kale,  
collards, turnips, pepper, potatoes,  
radishes, spinach, sweet corn and tomatoes.

TO CONTROL: asparagus beetle, aphids,  
leafhopper, whitefly, Mexican bean  
beetle, spotted cucumber beetle, cab-  
bage root fly, flea beetle, cabbage root  
miner, Colorado potato beetle, European  
spruce sawfly, green peach aphid, leafhoppers,  
European spruce sawfly, leafhoppers,  
Colorado potato beetle, whitefly, Japanese  
beetle.

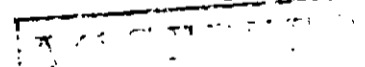
