**Contains Natural Pyrethrum**

For best results, use throughout the growing season to prevent buildups of insect infestations. Spray plants from a distance of 1 1/2 to 2 feet using short bursts of 1 second. To prevent injury to plants, avoid visibly wetting the foliage.

Apply in the early morning or late evening when the air is still, treating all foliage with particular attention to the undersides of leaves. Contact insects directly whenever possible. Repeat treatment every 7-10 days or as reinfestation occurs.
