The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all of the information submitted with your application to support the reregistration of the above referenced product in connection with the pyrethrins and piperonyl butoxide (PBO) REDs, and has concluded that your submission is acceptable.

NOTE: This product is <u>not</u> being reregistered under sections 3(c)5 and 4(g) of FIFRA at this time.

Please be reminded that 40 CFR Part 156.140(a)(4) requires that a batch code, lot number, or other code identifying the batch of the pesticide distributed and sold be placed on non-refillable containers. The code may appear either on the label or durably marked on the container itself, and can be added by non-notification per PRN 98-10.

Please note that the record for this product currently contains the Confidential Statements of Formulation (CSFs) listed below. Any previously dated CSFs are superseded.

## **DIRECTIONS FOR USE:**

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

#### **Use Restrictions**

Do not allow adults, children, or pets to enter until vapors, mists, and aerosols have dispersed, and the treated area has been thoroughly ventilated and until sprays have dried. Do not remain in treated area. Exit area immediately and remain outside the treated area until aerosols, vapors, and/or mists have dispersed. Remove or cover exposed food and drinking water before application. Remove or cover dishes, utensils, food processing equipment, and food preparation surfaces, or wash them before use.

Use Directions: SHAKE BEFORE USING. To spray: Hold container upright. Point valve opening away from face and press button, keeping at least 3 feet from interior walls, fabrics, furniture and plants. Spraying closer may cause stains or may damage

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certain floor or plastics. Keep room closed for 15 minutes. Do not use in serving area while food is exposed. Remove pets, birds, and cover and turn off fish aquariums before spraying. Do not apply this product in a way that will contact adults, children, or pets, either directly or through drift. All outdoor applications must be limited to spot or crack and crevice treatment only.

To kill flying insects: flies, mosquitoes, flying moths, gnats, wasps. With Johnson's Buggy Whip there is no need to spray directly at flying insects - the mist in the air will kill them. Close all doors and windows. Spray Buggy Whip up into the air with a sweeping motion.

To kill crawling insects: roaches, waterbugs, silverfish, crickets. Spray hiding places such as baseboards and floorboards, moist places, openings around sinks, drains and pipes, behind bookcases, cabinets and other storage areas. Repeat as needed.

To kill ants: Spray trails, hills, around windows and sills and openings around pipes and baseboards where ants crawl. Repeat as needed.

To kill spiders, centipedes, sow bugs: Spray webs and places where these pests crawl. Repeat as needed.

To kill carpet beetles: Hit these bugs directly with spray on sections of floor, baseboards, shelves and carpets. Repeat spraying as needed.

To kill bedbugs: Spray baseboards, moldings, floor boards. Spray mattresses, particularly around seams and tufts. Take beds apart and spray all joints. Repeat spraying as needed.

To kill fleas: Spray floors, floor coverings and sleeping quarters of pet. Repeat spraying as often as necessary. Do not spray pets.
