It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Using a Coastal Test Kit, adjust the pH of pool water, if necessary, to the pH range of 7.2 to 7.6. If the pH is below 7.2, add pH Plus. If it is above 7.6, add pH Minus. Tarry Long Lasting Chlorinating 8 oz. Tablets are intended for use in a Coastal tablet dispenser, the Coastal Automatic

In-Line Chlorinator, or other similar dispensers or in-line feeders. Adjust the chlorine dispensing rate of the dispenser or feeder to provide a chlorine residual of 1.0 to 2.0 ppm (parts per million). A suggested dosage is one tablet per 11,500 gallons per week. This dosage may vary due to unusual conditions such as heavy bather load, wind, heavy rains or high temperatures. If those conditions exist, frequent use of the test kit is recommended. Do not add these tablets directly to the pool or mix with any other chemicals.
