## **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Pour one-fourth of contents of this package (about ½ lb.) into toilet and flush down. For best results use at night before retiring, when water flow is lowest. Repeat treatment 4 times, within a few days, flushing each half pound portion. If necessary use a rod to make some flow.
- 2. Repeat the treatment outlined in step 1 every six months.

NOTE: Do not apply in sink or tub drains. Root Nox may be applied directly in the sewer line; apply 2 lbs. Root Nox at 6 month intervals.

Root Nox is not designed for badly neglected sewer damage by large, thick roots. Such sewers should be opened and repaired by a competent plumber first. Then use Root Nox regularly to attack roots when they are in the small, hair-like stage to prevent future stoppage.
