

Its primary application is in water-based products where VOC is a major concern. Use rates are based on laboratory and field evaluations and are typical for the use areas indicated. Use rates are reported as percentage weight/weight or TROY®EX2270, based on the weight of the final use product. Add TROY®EX2270 to paints and coatings at the end of the manufacturing cycle, after the final pH adjustment has been made, according to the following use-rates:

- Paint: 0.7 - 2.0%
- Wood protective stains: 0.5 - 2.0%
- Masonry coatings: 0.2 - 2.0%
- Roof coatings: 0.7 - 3.0%

Only for use in film forming applications where the product is bound by polymer in the film. Avoid spray application and application when rain is imminent. In order to prevent damage to surrounding vegetation cover all exposed vegetation near the application site.

Add TROY®EX2270 to caulks and sealants at the end of the production cycle with good agitation at 0.5-1.5%.
Add TROY®EX2270 to stucco at a rate of 0.5-1.5% and to joint cements at a rate of 0.5-1.2%.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling or reconditioning if available, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

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
