Subject: Amendment - General Label Update
DOVP 1 Spray
EPA Registration No. 5481-41
Your Application Dated October 10, 1984

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) is acceptable, provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. Revise the "If Swallowed" portion of the statement of practical treatment to read as follows:

If swallowed - Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. If possible, vomiting should be induced under medical supervision. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of throat with a finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person.

2. Add the following to the Note to Physician "Solvent presents aspiration hazard. Gastric lavage is indicated if material was taken internally."
3. Move the front panel recommendation about atropine so it appears in the note to physician.
4. Supply the flash point for this product. Depending on the flash point, the physical or chemical hazards statement may need to be revised.
5. In the use directions sentence about Brahman cattle hypersensitivity add also "or Brahman cross cattle."

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6. It appears that you have at least three distinct user groups for this product, farmers, pest control operators and veterinarians, based on the current use directions. Before add the following to the front panel of the label "For Agricultural/Commercial Pest Control/Veterinarian Use only." Then delete the use directions reading "For use by pest control operators or other trained personnel only" since it is unnecessary.
7. Delete "Outdoor areas such as picnic grounds...disposal areas" since it is confusing as to whether the product should be used indoors in these areas. Instead use the following.

For Use In Outside Areas Such As Picnic Grounds, Parking Areas, Loading Docks, Refuse Areas, Garbage Collection And Disposal Areas. Also For Use In Outside Areas Around Drive-In Restaurants, Food Processing Plants, And Warehouses.

8. Also in this section delete "Do not apply in edible products areas of food processing plants" and delete "cooking utensils" since they connote an indoor use which is not appropriate for this product.
9. In the fogging directions in animal buildings add the following respirator statement:

When fogging in animal buildings, wear a pesticide respirator jointly approved by the Mine Safety and Health Administration and by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health under the provisions of 30 CFR Part 11.

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the amended labeling.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals

DANGER: Poisonous if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through skin or eyes. Rapidly absorbed through skin. Repeated inhalation or skin contact may, without symptoms, progressively increase susceptibility to DDVP poisoning. Do not swallow or get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Do not breathe vapors. Keep out of reach of children and domestic animals. Do not contaminate water, feed or foodstuffs. Mix the concentrate outdoors or in a well ventilated room. Wear clean rubber gloves, waterproof protective clothing and goggles when handling the concentrate to prepare emulsions. Wear a pesticide respirator jointly approved by the Mining Enforcement and Safety Administration (formerly the U.S. Bureau of Mines) and by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health under the provisions of 30 CFR Part 11. Keep all unprotected persons out of operational area. In case of contact, wash immediately with soap and water. Wash thoroughly with soap and water before eating or smoking. Wash all contaminated clothing with soap and hot water before reuse.

Note to Physician — Warning Symptoms

Symptoms include weakness, headache, lightheadedness, blurred vision, non-reactive pin-point pupils, salivation, sweating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and abdominal cramps.

TREATMENT: Atropine is the specific therapeutic antagonist of choice against parasympathetic nervous stimulation. If there are signs of parasympathetic stimulation, atropine sulphate should be injected at 10-minute intervals, in doses of 1 to 2 milligrams until complete atropinization has occurred. Morphine is contraindicated. Clear chest by postural drainage. Repeated exposure to cholinesterase inhibitors may, without warning, cause prolonged susceptibility to very small doses of any cholinesterase inhibitor. Allow no further exposure until time for cholinesterase regeneration has been allowed as determined by blood test.

Environmental Hazards

This product is toxic to fish and wildlife. Do not apply directly to lakes, streams, or ponds. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

Physical or Chemical Hazards

Keep away from heat or open flame

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Do not apply to any area not specified on label. Not for use or storage in or around the home.

STORAGE & DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. **STORAGE:** Store product in original container in a cool, dry, locked place, out of reach of children. **PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous.
