FOR CONTROL OF BROWN PATCH IN SOUTHERN LAWNS

ST. AUGUSTINE, BERMUDA AND SIMILAR TURFGRASSES

For Brown Patch (*Rhizoctonia solani*)

HOW TO MIX- Mix 1 quart of this product in 10 gallons of water and apply to cover 1,000 Sq.Ft. of turf area.

WHEN TO APPLY- Apply in the fall or spring when disease first appears. Brown Patch occurs during hot weather. This disease causes large, circular brown patches of wilting and dead turf, 3 feet or more in diameter. Initially grass is purplish-green and quickly fades to light brown. During periods of warm humid weather, a dark purplish or grayish brown border called a smoke ring may appear around the patches. If the treated area is subjected to heavy rainfall, or flooding or if the disease is severe and conditions encourage disease growth, retreat the area at the same rate in 3 to 4 weeks. Under certain growing conditions a temporary discoloration of the grass may occur. This causes no harm and will disappear in a short time.

HOW TO APPLY- Use any good sprayer or sprinkling device that will deliver 1 1/2 gallons to 1,000 Sq. Ft. of turf in a short period of time. After treatment immediately follow with a light watering to insure movement through the grass to the soil level.

**DO NOT GRAZE TREATED AREAS.
DO NOT FEED CLIPPINGS TO LIVESTOCK**

AZALEAS AND CAMELLIAS

For Petal and Flower Blight apply as a drench to the soil under the plants using 1 1/2 Qt. in 30 gallons of water to cover 150 Sq.Ft. Begin treatment prior to bloom opening and repeat every 3 to 4 weeks through the bloom period.
