The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all the information submitted with your application to support the Registration Review of the above referenced product in connection with the Bifenthrin Interim Decision, and has concluded that your submission is acceptable. The label referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA, as amended, is acceptable.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to the company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act and is subject to review by the Agency. NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Organophosphate and Pyrethroid

ATROPINE IS THE EMERGENCY ANTIDOTE FOR SMARTCHOICE INSECTICIDE POISONING. 2-PAM IS ALSO ANTIDOTAL AND MAY BE USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH ATROPINE.

Warning Symptoms

SMARTCHOICE is an organophosphate insecticide containing a pyrethroid and is a cholinesterase inhibitor. Overexposure to this product may cause toxic signs and symptoms due to stimulation of the cholinergic nervous system.

Symptoms of poisoning may include weakness, headache, tightness in chest, blurred vision, non-reactive pin-point pupils, salivation, sweating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, muscle tremors and abdominal cramps. In severe cases, convulsions, unconsciousness and respiratory failure may occur.

Treatment

Atropine is the specific therapeutic antagonist of choice against this type of parasympathetic nervous stimulation. If warning symptoms appear, treatment should consist of parenteral atropine sulfate. This can be administered intramuscularly every 10 minutes until full atropinization (as indicated by dilated pupils, dry flushed skin and tachycardia) has been achieved and repeated thereafter whenever symptoms reappear. For infants and children, the dose of atropine sulfate is 0.05 mg/kg. For adults, 1 to 2 milligrams will be required for mild cases, but up to 4 mg may be needed for severe intoxication. 20 to 30 milligrams or more may be required during the first 24 hours.

Pralidoxime chloride (2-PAM chloride) may also be used as an effective antidote in addition to and while maintaining full atropinization. In adults, an initial dose of 1 gram of 2-PAM should be injected, preferably as an infusion in 250 cc of saline over a 15- to 30-minute period. If this is not practical, 2-PAM may be administered slowly by intravenous injection as a 5 percent solution in water over not less than two minutes. After about an hour, a second dose of 1 gram of 2-PAM will be indicated if muscle weakness has not been relieved. For infants and children, the dose of 2-PAM is 20-50 mg/kg. Morphine is an improper treatment.

Clear chest by postural drainage. Oxygen administration may be necessary. Observe patient continuously for 48 hours. Repeated exposure to cholinesterase inhibitors may, without warning, cause prolonged susceptibility to very small doses of any cholinesterase inhibitor. Allow no further exposure until cholinesterase regeneration has been attained as determined by blood test. Reversible skin sensations (parasthesia) may occur and ordinary skin salves have been found useful in reducing discomfort.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

DANGER: Fatal if swallowed. May be fatal if inhaled. Causes moderate eye irritation. Harmful if absorbed through the skin. Do not breathe dust. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, using tobacco or using the toilet. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse.

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. GENERAL INFORMATION

SMARTCHOICE 5G is a granular soil insecticide for use on corn (field, sweet, popcorn and seed) at planting for the control of northern, western and southern corn rootworm larvae, wireworms, cutworms, seedcorn maggots, white grubs, grape colaspis and symphylans.

Application

SMARTCHOICE 5G should be applied in-furrow at planting for optimum control of labeled pests. DO NOT apply as a surface band behind the press wheel.

In-Furrow Application at Planting:

Apply SMARTCHOICE 5G in conventional, conservation or no-till corn as an in-furrow treatment. Place the applicator tube either directly into or behind the planter shoe, so the granules drop into the open seed furrow and are completely covered with soil. In-furrow application provides optimum control of corn rootworms, wireworms, white grubs, seedcorn maggots, and grape colaspis.

Further Application Information:

- Under windy conditions the use of wind shields is recommended to ensure proper placement of granules.
- The SMARTBOX <u>Alternate Wording when packaged in LOCK 'N LOAD</u>: LOCK 'N LOAD system must be properly calibrated to assure an accurate application rate of SMARTCHOICE 5G.
- SMARTCHOICE 5G is non-corrosive to equipment and is nonflammable.

Alternate Wording when packaged in LOCK 'N LOAD:

SMARTCHOICE 5G CALIBRATION GUIDELINES

The following **equipment calibration procedures** must be performed to ensure that the proper amount of SMARTCHOICE 5G will be applied:

- 1. Fill insecticide hoppers with SMARTCHOICE 5G using Lock 'N Load containers.
- 2. Attach a collection container to each tube opening to catch the insecticide.
- 3. Set your planter to the initial gauge settings shown in the chart.
- 4. Measure off 250 ft of row and drive planter, while metering the insecticide, the premeasured distance at the speed at which you will be planting.
- 5. The target catch weight for each container is 0.88 and 1.25 oz of granules for the rates of 3.5 oz and 5.0 oz per 1000 ft, respectively, when collected for 250 ft of row. Determine the amount caught in each row either by weight or by volumetric approximation of weight.
- 6. Repeat the calibration procedure above, as needed, until the insecticide caught in each container is as close as possible to the target amount.

SMARTCHOICE 5G must be applied with the SMARTBOX system. Please refer to the SMARTBOX operator's manual for detailed information on system operation and calibration procedures.

<u>Alternate Wording when packaged in SMARTBOX</u>: **DO NOT ATTEMPT TO OPEN OR TAMPER WITH THE CONTAINER.** DO NOT ATTEMPT TO REPAIR THE SMARTBOX APPLICATION SYSTEM. IF REPAIRS ARE NECESSARY, CONTACT YOUR AMVAC SALES REPRESENTATIVE OR THE MANUFACTURER OF THE APPLICATION SYSTEM.

VEGETATIVE FILTER STRIPS

Construct and maintain a vegetative filter strip, according to the width specified below, of grass or other permanent vegetation between the field edge and nearby down gradient aquatic habitat (such as, but not limited to, lakes; reservoirs; rivers; streams; marshes or natural ponds; estuaries; and commercial fish farm ponds).

Only apply products containing bifenthrin onto fields where a maintained vegetative filter strip of at least 25 feet exists between the field edge and where a down gradient aquatic habitat exists. This minimum required width of 25 feet may be reduced or removed under the following conditions:

- For Western irrigated agriculture, a maintained vegetative filter strip of at least 10 feet wide is required. Western irrigated agriculture is defined as irrigated farmland in the following states: WA, OR, CA, ID, NV, UT, AZ, MT, WY, CO, NM, and TX (west of I-35).
 - o For Western irrigated agriculture, if a sediment control basin is present, a vegetative filter strip is not required.
- In all other areas, a vegetative filter strip with a minimum width of 25 feet is required, unless the following conditions are met. The vegetative filter strip requirement may be reduced from 25 feet to 15 feet if at least one of the following applies:

- o The area of application is considered prime farmland (as defined in 7 CFR § 657.5).
- o Conservation tillage is being implemented on the area of application. Conservation tillage is defined as any system that leaves at least 30% of the soil surface covered by residue after planting. Conservation tillage practices can include mulch-till, no-till, or strip-till.
- o A functional terrace system is maintained on the area of application.
- o Water and sediment control basins for the area of application are functional and maintained.
- o The area of application is less than or equal to 10 acres.

Do not apply within 25 feet of aquatic habitats (such as, but not limited to, lakes, reservoirs, rivers, streams, marches, ponds, estuaries, and commercial fish ponds).

Resistance Management

For resistance management, please note that SMARTCHOICE 5G contains both Group 1B (chlorethoxyfos) and Group 3A (bifenthrin) insecticides. Any insect population may contain individuals naturally resistant to SMARTCHOICE 5G and other Group 1 or Group 3 insecticides. The resistant individuals may dominate the insect population if this group of insecticides are used repeatedly in the same locations. Appropriate resistance management strategies should be followed.

To delay insecticide resistance, take one or more of the following steps:

- Rotate the use of SMARTCHOICE 5G or other Group 1 or Group 3 insecticides within the year with different groups that control the same pests.
- Use combinations with insecticides from a different group that are equally effective on the target pest when such use is permitted. Do not rely on the same combination repeatedly for the same pest population. Consider any known cross-resistance issues (for the targeted pests) between the individual components of the mixture. In addition, consider the following recommendations from the Insect resista
- nce Action Committee (IRAC):
 - o Individual insecticides selected for use in mixtures should be highly effective and be applied at the rates at which they are individually registered for use against the target species.
 - o Combinations with components having the same IRAC mode of action classification are not recommended for insect resistance management.
 - O When using combinations, consider any known cross-resistance issues between the individual components for the targeted pests.
 - O Combinations become less effective if resistance is already developing to one or both active ingredients, but they may still provide pest management benefits.
 - The insect resistance management benefits of an insecticide combination are greater if the two components have similar periods of residual insecticidal activity. Combinations of insecticides with unequal periods of residual insecticide activity may offer an insect resistance management benefit only for the period where both insecticides are active.
- Adopt an integrated insect management program for insecticide use that includes scouting, uses historical
 information related to pesticide use record keeping, and which considers cultural, biological and other
 chemical control practices.
- Monitor after application for unexpected target pest survival. If the level of survival suggests the presence of resistance, consult with your local university specialist or certified pest control advisor.
- Contact your local extension specialist or pest control advisor for any additional pesticide resistance-management and/or IPM recommendations for specific site and pest problems in your area.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Store in a secure, locked, dry and temperate area where children, unauthorized persons or animals cannot enter. Keep the container capped when not in use. Do not contaminate water, other pesticides, fertilizer, food or feed by storage or disposal.
