

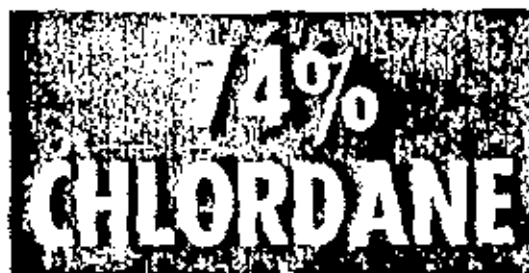

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable. A stamped copy is enclosed for your records.

At the next label printing, incorporate the following revisions:

1. Revise the Statement of Practical Treatment to read:

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

- If swallowed - Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of throat with finger. If possible, vomiting should be induced under medical supervision. DO NOT induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
- If inhaled - Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.
- If on skin - Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water.
- If in eyes - Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a physician immediately.

2. In the Precautionary Statements, under the subheading Hazards To Humans And Domestic Animals, remove the parenthesis from "And Domestic Animals." Also delete the word, "Important" from the signal word, Warning.

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3. In the Precautionary Statements, under the subheading Environmental Hazards, delete the following sentences which may appear:

- a Birds feeding on treated areas may be killed.
- b Birds and other wildlife in treated areas may be killed.
- c Do not apply where runoff is likely to occur.
- d Do not apply when weather favors drift from treated areas.

4. Delete the disposal statements which precede the specific use directions. The disposal statements following the specific use directions are sufficient.

Since this product is subject to the child-resistant (special) packaging regulations, submit a signed certification statement that the packaging complies with these requirements.

Refer to 40 CFR 162.16 "Pesticides Requiring Special Packaging" and the Federal Register Vol. 46, No. 41, Tuesday, March 3, 1981, pps. 15104-15109, "Clarification of Policy Issues on Special Packaging," for guidance and proper submission requirements.
