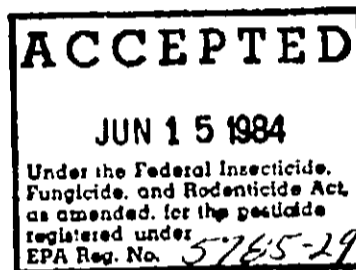

Statement of Practical Treatment

- If Inhaled: Remove victim to fresh air immediately. Keep victim lying down and warm. Give artificial respiration if breathing has stopped. Call a physician at once.
- If Swallowed: Call a physician or Poison Control Center. Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything to an unconscious person.
- Skin Contact: Remove contaminated clothing and shoes immediately. Wash exposed areas thoroughly with soap and water. Blistering and/or a rash may develop from skin contact. Seek medical attention promptly. Clean or launder contaminated clothing before reuse. Do not reuse clothing or shoes until completely free of chemical odor.
- Eye Contact: Immediately flush eyes thoroughly with running water for at least 15 minutes. Seek medical attention promptly.

DANGER

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Do not use containers, handling or application equipment made of aluminum, magnesium (or their alloys). Use of these materials may cause a violent chemical reaction leading to fire and explosion. Other incompatible materials include polypropylene, polyvinyl chloride and rubber. If ethylene dibromide is subjected to temperatures below 50°F., warm to 55° and mix thoroughly before using.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

STORAGE, SHIPMENT AND DISPOSAL

Storage: Store in tightly closed containers in a cool place away from dwellings. In outside storage, store drums on their sides. Do not allow contamination of water, food or feed, plants, fertilizers and other pesticides by storage.

Shipment: Do not ship with food, feeds, drugs or clothing.

Pesticide Disposal: Ethylene dibromide that cannot be used must be disposed of in accordance with the requirements of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act and the regulations thereunder. Quantities exempted from these disposal requirements by virtue of small volume must be disposed of in an approved landfill or incinerator.

Container Disposal: Triple rinse (or equivalent) and offer for recycling, reuse, burn, or disposal in approved landfill or incinerator.

General: Consult Federal, State or Local official authorities for approved alternative procedures. OPEN DUMPING IS PROHIBITED.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

For use only as a commodity fumigant on fresh citrus fruit and papaya for quarantine control of fruit flies. Use only in accordance with the recommendations and instructions issued by the United States Department of Agriculture for quarantine programs. Use only under the direction and supervision of Federal/State personnel for quarantine treatments.

RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

Ethylene dibromide may NOT be used after September 1, 1984 for the commodity treatment of fresh citrus fruit or papaya for United States consumption.

After September 1, 1984 citrus fruit for export outside of the territorial United States may be treated only during the months of October, November, December, and January. The treatment of citrus fruit for export in any other month is permitted only after a written determination by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency that a significant fruit fly outbreak has resulted in quarantine requirements for exported fruit which cannot be met by alternative quarantine treatments and that treatment with EDB for such purposes will not cause unreasonable adverse effects on the environment.

After September 1, 1984 all persons actively engaged in the application or handling of EDB or in the cleanup of any EDB spills must wear self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) respirators approved by MSHA/NIOSH. EDB-resistant gloves made of butyl rubber only and boot covers and apron made of butyl rubber, nitrile, or polyethylene must also be used. All persons entering fumigation chambers for any purpose within 24 hours before application must wear SCBA respirators approved by MSHA/NIOSH.

After September 1, 1984 fumigation chambers must have ventilation stacks which extend at least 30 feet above the rooftop of each fumigation chamber. Fumigated areas must be placarded on all entrances with signs containing at least the signal word DANGER and the words "Ethylene Dibromide" and the words "Area under fumigation, do not enter until completely aerated," the date of fumigation, name of the fumigant used, emergency telephone number for contact, and the name and address of the fumigator. Do not remove warning signs until the fumigated area is completely aerated and safe for entry, as indicated by a suitable detector.

Fumigated fruits shipped by truck directly from the fumigation chambers, without interim storage at the site of fumigation, must be aerated in transit to warehouse storage or loading areas. Aerate materials for use in a list of receiving trucks from the chamber.
