

GENERAL DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Lawn Weed Killer contains both 2,4-D and 4,5% Trichlorophenoxyacetic acid. To kill weeds in lawns, dandelions, wild onion, poison ivy, plantain, henbit, chickweed, and other weeds, use 8 ounces in 6 gallons of water and apply with a spray or sprinkling can to 2,400 square feet of lawn. (For smaller areas use 2 teaspoonsful in 2 quarts of water applied to 100 sq. feet.) Do not apply to areas underlaid by trees or shrubs.

To kill weeds such as thistles, bindweed, dock and ragweed, use 8 ounces in 6 gallons of water (or 2 teaspoonsful in 2 quarts of water), and apply directly to plants, wetting them thoroughly. Repeat as necessary.

To kill ivy, poison ivy and poison oak, use 8 teaspoonsful in 2 quarts of water and drown plants when they are fully leafed. Repeat in about 4 weeks if necessary. Certain hard to kill weeds such as poison ivy, poison oak, English daisy may require a fast application.

NOTICE: Buyer assumes all risks of use, storage or handling of this product not in strict accordance with directions given herein.

WASHING: Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. In case of contact, flush with abundance of water; for eyes, get medical attention. Do not take internally. Keep out of the reach of children.

IMPORTANT: Avoid drift of spray (coarse sprays are less likely to drift) on to vegetables, flowers, ornamental shrubs, trees, and other desirable crop plants. Do not contaminate domestic or irrigation waters. Do not pour solution used to clean sprayer nor desirable plants or where it may contaminate water. Do not store in direct contact with fertilizer, seeds, insecticides, or fungicides. Do not use on centipede grass, St. Augustine or dichondra nor on lawns or turf where desirable bent grass or clovers are present. Newly seeded lawns may be treated after they have been mowed the second time. To reseed small areas in treated lawns, wait at least 3 weeks after spraying. A good rain or deep watering should occur during this period. When container is empty, immediately wash thoroughly and destroy. Never reuse. Use spray equipment for applying 2,4-D combination is only to turf.

BLACK LEAF LAWN WEED KILLER is effective for the control of dandelion, chickweed, clover, dock, dog fennel, English ivy, fireweed, knotweed erect, knotweed prostrate, ground ivy, horseweed, horsetail, hemp, lamb's-quarters, mayweed, pennycress, chickweed (without common chickweed); mustard, onions, pennywort, coppergrass, goosefoot, plantain, poison ivy, poison oak, Canada thistle, bluestem, Timothy, redtop, purpletop, smoothweed, sheep sorrel, spotted spurge, wild aster, wild carrot, wild onions, wild radish, wood sorrel, bindweed and yarrow.





