CAUTION

This product is toxic to fish and wildlife. Birds feeding on treated area may be killed. Keep out of lakes, streams, and ponds. Apply only as specified on the label. Dispose of wastes by burying on noncrop lands away from water supplies. Dispose of containers by burning. Keep out of smoke.

Do not apply when weather conditions favor drift from areas treated. Do not apply where run off is likely to occur. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

ANTIDOTE

Internal — Give sodium chloride 15 g. (one tablespoonful of table salt) in glass of warm water and repeat until vomit is clear. Call a doctor immediately.

External — Wash with soap and water.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

European Corn Borer Control! — Apply 20 pounds per acre by either ground equipment or by airplane. A second application may be required 7 to 10 days later. A third application may be required for control of second-brood borers. Consult State Extension Service specialists for most effective application dates.

Do not feed ensilage made from treated corn plants to dairy animals or animals being finished for slaughter. Do not allow dairy animals or animals being finished for slaughter to graze or feed on treated stover.
