<b>STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT</b> Organophosphate

<b>NOTE TO PHYSICIAN</b>		
<b>POISONING SYMPTOMS:</b> Weakness, headache, tightness in chest, blurred vision, non-reactive pinpoint pupils, salivation, sweating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, and abdominal cramps. <b>TREATMENT:</b> Administer atropine sulfate in therapeutic doses. Repeat as necessary to the point of tolerance. Compound inhibits cholinesterase resulting in stimulation of the central nervous system, the parasympathetic nervous system, and the somatic motor nerves. Do not give morphine. Watch for pulmonary edema which may develop in serious cases of poisoning even after 12 hours. 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## DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or indirectly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application.

For any requirements specific to your State or Tribe, consult the agency responsible for pesticide regulation.

### AGRICULTURAL USE REQUIREMENTS

#### NOTIFICATION TO WORKERS:

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR 170. This Standard contains requirements for the protection of agricultural workers on farms, forests, nurseries, and greenhouses, and handlers of agricultural pesticides. It contains requirements for training, decontamination, notification, and emergency assistance. It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), notification to workers and restricted-entry intervals. The requirements in this box only apply to uses of this product that are covered by the Worker Protection Standards.

Do not enter or allow worker entry into treated areas during the restricted entry interval (REI) of 24 hours.

**PPE REQUIRED FOR EARLY ENTRY** to treated areas that is permitted under the Worker Protection Standard and that involves contact with anything that has been treated, such as plants, soil, or water is:

1. Coveralls over long-sleeved shirt and long pants
2. Chemical-resistant gloves, such as barrier laminate or nitrile rubber or viton
3. Chemical-resistant footwear plus socks
4. Protective eyewear
5. Chemical-resistant handgear for overhead exposure.

Notify workers of the application by warning them orally and by posting signs at entrances to treated areas.

#### METHOD OF APPLICATION

1. Close all windows, doors, and ventilators.
2. Calculate the area in cubic feet of the house to be treated.
3. Use two (2) fluid ounces of Summit MUSHROOM HOUSE FOGGING INSECTICIDE per 3000 cubic feet of space. Do not exceed 2.0 gms a.i./1000 cubic feet. Keep a minimum of 7 day intervals between applications.
4. Pour the exact amount of insecticide needed for the calculated area into the insecticide tank of the thermal fog generator.
5. Adjust the metering valve or orifice size in the insecticide line to produce a dry fog. Never apply a wet fog. A flow rate of 8 fluid ounces per minute is recommended.
6. For best results, the mushroom house should remain closed for 1-1/2 hours after fogging. The house should then be completely ventilated for at least one (1) hour before early re-entry. (See "PPE REQUIRED FOR EARLY ENTRY" above).

### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

**STORAGE:** Store in a cool, dry place. Do not store near heat or open flame.

**PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency or the Hazardous Waste Representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

**CONTAINER DISPOSAL:** Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by State and local authorities.

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
