

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If swallowed - Call a physician or poison control center immediately. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. If possible, vomiting should be induced under medical supervision. Repeat until vomit is clear. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person.

In inhaled - Remove victim to fresh air and apply respiration if indicated.

If on skin - Remove all contaminated clothing and wash with soap and water. If signs of cholinesterase inhibition appear, or if irritation persists, get medical attention.

If in eyes - Flush with plenty of water. If irritation persists, get medical attention.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN:

POISONING SYMPTOMS: Symptoms include weakness, headache, tightness in chest, blurred vision, non-reactive pinpoint pupils, salivation, sweating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, and abdominal cramps.

TREATMENT: Atropine is the specific therapeutic antagonist of choice against parasympathetic nervous stimulation. If there are signs of parasympathetic stimulation, Atropine Sulfate should be injected at 10-minute intervals in doses of 1 to 2 milligrams until complete Atropinization has occurred. Atropine is also antidotal and may be administered in conjunction with Atropine. Morphine is contraindicated. Clear chest by postural drainage. Observe patient continuously for 48 hours. Repeated exposure to cholinesterase inhibitors may, without warning, cause prolonged susceptibility to very small doses of any cholinesterase inhibitor. Allow no further exposure until time for cholinesterase-regeneration has been allowed as determined by blood test.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS

DANGER

Do not get in mouth, fatal if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through skin. Wear rubber gloves while filling, running or emptying machine. Do not get liquid in eyes. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wear protective clothing. Wash hands, arms and face with soap and water after handling and before eating or smoking. Do not contaminate food products by direct contact with liquid. Wear clean natural rubber gloves, protective clothing, and goggles, face shield or equivalent. It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

RE-ENTRY STATEMENT

The building should be opened and aired prior to re-entry of unprotected workers or remain unoccupied by unprotected workers for at least 6 hours after treatment.

Summit 5% DDVP is a specially formulated insecticide designed for use in the control of exposed stages of stored-product insects infesting warehouses containing non-perishable, packaged or bagged raw or processed food commodities. The term "non-perishable, means any raw or processed food not subject to rapid decay or deterioration that would render it unfit for consumption. Raw commodities would include cocoa beans, field-dried beans, field-dried peas, grains and nuts. Not included are eggs, milk, meat, poultry, fresh fruits and vegetables such as onions, parsnips, potatoes and carrots. Processed foods would include flour, sugar, cereal, packaged cookies, and crackers. Not included are hermetically sealed foods or manufactured dairy products and other processed foods requiring refrigeration.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:

Undiluted ULV Space Spray:

For control of the exposed stages and the prevention of migration of most species of stored product insects, rice weevils, confused flour beetles, saw-toothed grain beetles, cigarette beetles, Indian-meal moths, and cocoa bean moths in

warehouse storage areas, and in food processing areas of flour and grain mills, bakeries, canning and bottling plants, and brewery warehouses during times when the plant is not in operation and no food products are exposed. If bulk, un-packaged foods are exposed, remove or cover before spraying begins. Food should be removed or covered before treatment. All food processing surfaces should be covered during treatment or thoroughly cleaned before using. When using the product in these areas apply only when the facility is not in operation. Use Summit 5% DDVP in a ULV type machine, adjusted to deliver small particles. The rate of application should be between 1-2 grams of actual DDVP per 1,000 cu. ft. or 1/2 to 1 oz. of liquid per 1,000 cu. ft. Check amount in insecticide tank or auxiliary tank before and after treatment to assure proper dosage has been applied.

Treatment should be made during the hours when buildings are unoccupied. Buildings treated should be closed and ventilation kept at a minimum during application of the insecticide. Lock all entrances and do not allow unprotected workers to enter while being treated. Place Caution Signs at all entrances stating, "Do not enter prior to _____ o'clock _____ (date) without protection". Repeat treatment at weekly intervals during season of peak insect activity for optimum results.

Diluted Space And Contact Spray:

Dilute with oil to 1-3% and apply at the rate of 1 gallon of spray per 64,000 cu. ft. to kill roaches, silverfish, fleas, waterbugs, earwigs, ants, spiders, in sheltered situations. Adjust a ULV Spraying device to a coarse spray for control of the above listed crawling insects. Contact as many of the insects with the spray as possible. Thoroughly spray all parts of the room suspected of harboring these insects. Special attention should be paid to cracks, hidden surfaces under equipment, and food storage areas. Then adjust the ULV device to deliver a fine spray for use as a space spray. Sweep up and destroy dead insects. Repeat treatment as necessary. Exposed food should be removed or covered before treatment. All food processing surfaces should be covered during treatment or thoroughly cleaned before processing is resumed. When using this product in these areas, apply only when facility is not in operation.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Store in a cool, dry place. Do not store near heat or open flame. Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL:

Metal Containers: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.

Glass Containers: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then dispose of in a sanitary landfill or by other approved state and local procedures.

Plastic Containers: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or incineration, or, if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
