DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Stir well until entire contents have the same consistency. Before treating poles, all decayed wood should be removed. By means of a brush, trowel or other suitable device, apply a coating approximately 1/8-inch thick and over an area 18 inches to 24 inches wide. Usually not over 2 to 6 inches of the treatment extends above the ground line. When treatment is applied below ground line, that portion should be wrapped with suitable plastic coated paper. Covering all of the treatment with such paper is a recommended practice.

DANGER

May be fatal if swallowed. In case of swallowing take an emetic to induce vomiting — CALL A PHYSICIAN. Do not breathe vapors. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing.
