NOTE: This product degrades with age. Use a chlorine test kit and increase dosage as necessary to obtain the required level of available chlorine.

START OF SEASON OR FOR NEWLY FILLED SWIMMING POOLS
Add 10 oz./10,000 gallons of water (equivalent to 1.0 PPM available chlorine). Test with a reliable chlorine test kit and continue adding smaller amounts (1 oz./10,000 gallons equivalent to 0.1 available chlorine) if necessary until a residual of 0.6 to 1.0 PPM is established as determined by the test kit, and maintain at this level. Keep the pH at 7.2 to 7.6 at all times as determined by an adequate pH test kit.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store in cool, dry area away from direct sunlight. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water and either return to manufacturer or discard by placing in trash collection or burying in an approved landfill. Product or residue that cannot be used should be diluted with water and disposed of in a sanitary sewer. Do not contaminate food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment.

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
