TO CONTROL AMBROSIA BEETLES IN LUMBER DURING SEASONING

Ambrosia beetles may attack green lumber during the first stages of seasoning if unprotected.

Add one gallon of Beetle Kil to each 160 gallons of anti-stain solution in the dip tank. Agitate to form an emulsion. If dip tank is left undisturbed for more than 15 minutes, agitate well. Immersion in this mixture in the dip tank by lumber is steady enough to keep the active ingredient in suspension.

TO CONTROL AMBROSIA BEETLES, BARK BEETLES, AND WOOD BORERS IN LOGS

Add one gallon of Beetle Kil to 25 gallons of Diesel fuel or No. 2 fuel oil and mix well. Water can also be used at the same rate of dilution. The protection offered will last 6 to 12 months.

Spray entire surface of logs including cut ends. One gallon of spray should cover a maximum of 100 square feet of area. A power sprayer is recommended.

Logs should be sprayed within 24 hours of cutting.

For storage of logs for a period of several months spray the ground under the logs.

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STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

Pesticide Disposal: Pesticide wastes are toxic. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture or rinsate is a violation of Federal law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

Container Disposal: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.

DISPOSITION OF WASTE: The following shall apply to all dip solutions except those intended for household use. Dip solutions shall be disposed of in accordance with the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). If the application generates more than 1000 kg of used dip solution per application or more than 1000 kg of used dip solution per application with other hazardous waste, the material must be treated as a hazardous waste subject to regulation under RCRA. Any user of water to treat, store or dispose of hazardous waste must obtain a permit to serve as a hazardous waste treatment, storage, or disposal unit.

EPA Registration No. 6651-11

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable, provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. Add the following additional protective clothing statement to the front panel, "Mixers/loaders must wear goggles or a face shield, waterproof apron, and waterproof gloves."
2. The labeling should be brought into compliance with current label requirements. Refer to the enclosure and modify the headings, format, and type size accordingly.
3. Add the statement "It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling" to the beginning of the use directions.
4. Revise the Statement of Practical Treatment. We suggest the following statement; however, if your toxicological data suggest otherwise, please submit a draft Statement of Practical Treatment for prior approval:

If swallowed - Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. Vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia.

If inhaled - Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.

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If on skin - Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected
area with soap and water.

If in eyes - Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a
physician immediately.

Note to Physician - Solvent presents aspiration hazard.
Gastric lavage is indicated if material
was taken internally.

5. Add "and before eating or smoking" to "wash thoroughly after handling."

6. Delete "do not apply where runoff is likely to occur" from the label
as the Agency no longer requires this statement.

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before
you release the product for sale with the amended labeling.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

If you hold a Federal registration, a supplemental registration, or
a Special Local Use's registration, you may continue to produce new stocks
of such products, using current labeling, until ~~April 4~~^{April 3}, 1964. After that
date, all remaining inventories of affected products will fall under the
existing stocks provisions stated in our letter of October 28, 1963.
