USE RESTRICTION
This product is for use only on California ground squirrels adjacent to cropland, nurseries, and other areas where plants are growing. Do not use this product on any other species of squirrel. For more information, consult the label or contact the manufacturer.

PREBAITING
Prebaited oat groats should be available for 2-3 days prior to application of bait.

BAITING
Treatment should be applied only during the dormant period of the squirrel. Bait should be applied along the right-of-way using the dispenser device on each acre. Bait will be available for 30 days. Do not re-treat. Dispose of bait by burial within the container.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL
Do not contaminate water. Open containers should be triple-rinsed. Do not reuse. Pesticide that cannot be used should be disposed of according to local, state, and federal disposal authorities.

NOTICE
This product is a restricted use pesticide. Only persons who are certified or licensed under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act may use this product.

Apply 1 lb. of bait per 100 sq. ft. of area to be treated. Broadcast bait in a 10-15 foot swath along right-of-way, using hand or ground-frozen bait dispensing device not to exceed 6 pounds per acre. Bait will be applied to the canal right-of-way between the base of the levee and the canal property. The canal will also be treated. Dispose of excess bait and equipment by burial within three days after treatment.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS
Zinc phosphide is highly toxic to humans and animals. It may be fatal if swallowed or inhaled. Avoid contact with water. Do not apply near water.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE
It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

USE RESTRICTIONS For control of California ground squirrels on noncrop rights of way adjacent to canal and ditch banks and other noncrop borders during late spring and summer. Zinc phosphide must not be applied on roads near residential areas, over water, or where plants are grown for food or feed. Before undertaking ground squirrel control with this product, consult Local, State and Federal government authorities to insure use is in accordance with regulations.

PREBAITING Prebait with 6 pounds of untreated oat groats per acre along rights of way 2-3 days prior to applying bait to ensure bait acceptance by ground squirrels.

BAITING Treat only once during treatment period and only after prebaiting is completed. Broadcast bait in a 10-15 foot swath along right-of-way using hand or ground-frozen bait dispensing device not to exceed 6 pounds per acre. Bait will be applied to the canal right-of-way between the base of the levee and the canal property. The canal will also be treated. Dispose of excess bait and equipment by burial within three days after treatment.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal. Open burning and dumping are prohibited. Do not reuse empty container. Pesticide that cannot be used or otherwise repressed should be disposed of according to procedures approved by Federal, State, or Local disposal authorities. Before disposing of container, consult Federal, State, or Local disposal authorities for approved procedures.

NOTICE This pesticide is a restricted use pesticide. It may be used only by or under the supervision of a person certified by the State of California to apply restricted use pesticides.
