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SUGGESTED PROCEDURES FOR SAFE DISPOSAL OF EMPTY CONTAINERS

For the purpose of this document, empty containers are defined as containers that have been completely emptied of their original contents and are ready for disposal.

Glass Containers - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for glass waste.

Fiber and Paper Containers - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for paper and fiber waste.

Metal Containers - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for metal waste.

One Gallon Can - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for one gallon cans.

Five Gallon, Thirty Gallon, and Fifty Five Gallon Drums - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for five gallon, thirty gallon, and fifty five gallon drums.

5 gallon drums - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for 5 gallon drums.

30 gallon drums - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for 30 gallon drums.

55 gallon drums - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for 55 gallon drums.

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IF THE ABOVE RINSE METHOD CANNOT BE USED - In this case, the containers should be disposed of in a designated area for containers that cannot be rinsed.

Containers that cannot be rinsed - These containers should be disposed of in a designated area for containers that cannot be rinsed.

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
