 - b. Delete the word "milk."
 - c. Delete the statement "Measures against circulatory shock . . . may be needed" from the "Note to Physician" section.
2. Submit five (5) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.
