The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, is acceptable provided that you:

1. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:
 - a. Expand the Environmental Hazards statement to read as follows:

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not discharge effluent containing this active ingredient into lakes, streams, ponds, estuaries, oceans, or public waters unless this product is specifically identified and addressed in an NPDES permit. Do not discharge effluent containing this product to sewer systems without previously notifying the sewage treatment plant authority. For guidance, contact your State Water Board or Regional Office of the EPA.

- b. Under Directions for Use add the following misuse statement:

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. For eyes, call a physician. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

If swallowed drink promptly a large quantity of milk, egg whites, gelatin solution, or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Call a physician immediately.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Hyamine 2389 - 50% is a concentrate for formulating purposes only. Use only in accordance with the directions in the Technical Bulletin from the manufacturer.

NOTE: This product should not be used or compounded with any reducing or oxidizing agents such as calcium hypochlorite, solid perchlorate, or nitric acid since such admixtures may be hazardous.

Do not use in conjunction with soap or any anionic wetting agent.

Insure uniformly. Keep container closed to avoid loss of solvent.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

- Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage disposal.
- Do not store on side.
- Avoid creasing or impacting of side walls.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL

Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray material, or empty containers is a violation of Federal Law.
