The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling.

1. In the Statement of Practical Treatment section, revise "If swallowed, immediately give 3-4 glasses of milk; if unavailable, give water" to read:

If swallowed promptly drink a large quantity of egg whites, gelatin solution, or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol. Call a physician immediately.

2. Place the signal word "DANGER" immediately below the statement "Keep Out of Reach of Children."

Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.



STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If swallowed, immediately give 2-4 glasses of milk; if unavailable, give water. Do not induce vomiting. Call a physician.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: Probable mucosal damage may contraindicate the use of gastric lavage. Measures against circulatory shock, respiratory depression, and convulsion may be needed.

This pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not discharge effluent containing this active ingredient into lakes, streams, ponds, estuaries, oceans, or public waters, unless this product is specifically identified and addressed in NPDES permit. Do not discharge effluent containing this product to sewer systems without previously notifying the sewer-treatment-plant authority. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Hyamine 3500-50% is a concentrate for formulating disinfectants. Use only in accordance with the directions in the Bulletin from the manufacturer.

NOTE: This product should not be used or combined with reducing or oxidizing agents (such as calcium hypochlorite, or nitric acid) since such mixture is explosive. Do not use in conjunction with soap or wetting agent.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

- Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.
- Do not store on side.

CONTAINER HANDLING

Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or for disposal in a sanitary landfill, or incineration, or, if burned, stay out of smoke.
