Dear Ms. Holcombe:

The following amendment, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with conditions.

Proposed Amendment

Update storage and Disposal language per PR Notice 2007-4

Conditions

Revise the label as follows:

1.) Relocate the "Personal Protective Equipment", "User Safety Requirements," and "User Safety Recommendations," sections on page 2 to appear after the "Precautionary Statements." Also delete the "User Safety Recommendations" heading because it isn't in compliance with PR Notice 2000-5, Mandatory Labeling. The User Safety Requirements heading is acceptable for both sections.

2.) Qualify fiberglass as a hard nonporous surface on page 3 by stating "sealed" fiberglass. Also, qualify outdoor furniture as hard nonporous surface on page by adding the disclaimer, "except for wooden frames and cushions."

3.) Qualify that non-food contact surfaces are being treated in refrigerators on page 3 by stating refrigerator "exteriors."

4.) The nomenclature for Salmonella choleraesuis must be updated to read "Salmonella enterica" on page 4.

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microorganisms are viruses by stating "Herpes Simplex Type 2 Virus, Vaccinia Virus, Avian Influenza Virus, Feline leukemia Virus, and Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis Virus."

6.) Since the product makes hard surface cleaning and deodorizing claims on page 1, add the following heading above the "To Disinfect" directions on page 6:

Cleaning/Deodorizing: Apply 1 oz per gallon of water to hard nonporous surfaces with cloth, mop, sponge, or sprayer. Allow surface to air dry.

7.) Revise the last statement under the "To Disinfect" directions on page 6 and the 6th statement under the "Livestock, Turkey, and Poultry House Disinfectant" directions on page 8 to be incompliance with PR Notice 2000-5, Mandatory Labeling, by deleting the term, recommended.

8.) Since this product is utilized as a disinfectant as well as fungicidal when treating trucks, footbaths, urinal, toilets, you must add the following directions for these sites with an appropriate heading:

- a) **Fungicidal**: Phenocide 128 is an effective fungicide against *Trichophyton mentagrophytes* (agent causes athlete's foot fungus) and *Candidia albicans* in areas such as locker rooms, dressing rooms, shower and bath areas. Follow disinfection directions.
- b) **Toilet/Urinal Disinfection**: Remove gross filth prior to disinfection. Empty toilet/urinal. Apply 1 oz per gallon of water to with a cloth, toilet brush, sponge or mechanical sprayer. Brush over exposed surfaces and under the rim. Allow surfaces to remain wet for 10 minutes. Then flush.
- c) Footbaths: After using footbath, drain and refill with fresh water to just cover intake valve or highest jet. Apply 1 oz per each gallon of fresh water added. Start the pump to circulate the solution. Wash down the sides, seat of chair, related equipment, and uncovered surfaces with a sponge, cloth, or brush. Treated surfaces must remain wet for 10 minutes. After the foot spa has been thoroughly disinfected, drain the solution from the unit and finse surfaces with fresh water. Wipe dry with a clean cloth/sponge or allow to air dry. Repeat after each use.
- d) Salon/Barber Instruments and Tools Disinfection: Preclean heavily soiled instruments and tools prior to disinfection. Completely immerse combs, brushes, razors, scissors, blades, plastic rollers, manicure and other salon/barber instruments and tools for 10 minutes. Rinse thoroughly with water and dry before reuse. Fresh solution must be prepared daily or more often if solution becomes diluted or soiled.

Note: Plastics may remain immersed until ready to use. Stainless steel sheers and instruments must be removed after 10 minutes, rinsed, dried, and kept in a clean, non-contaminated receptacle. Prolonged soaking may cause damage to metal

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e) Vehicles: Apply 1 oz per gallon of water to vehicles including mats, crates, cabs, and wheels. Leave all treated surfaces wet for 10 minutes. Allow to air dry or wipe excess liquid with clean sponge or cloth.

9.) Revise the 3rd-6th statements under the "Hatchery" directions on page 7 by stating "*Remove chickens/chicks, loose wastes, gross filth, and heavy soil deposits prior to disinfecting.* Preclean in accordance with Cleaning and Deodorizing directions. Apply loz per 1 gallon of water to hard nonporous surfaces. Leave all treated surfaces wet for 10 minutes. Allow to air dry or wipe excess liquid with cloth or sponge".


