DIRECTIONS FOR USE

PYRENONE MILL FOG is a finished insecticide in ready to use form for the control of certain exposed insect pests of stored grain, stored food products. It has been especially formulated for use in Dyna-Fog, Swing Fog, Aero-Master and other thermal foggers. It is also ideally suited for use as a surface spray in pressure and hand sprayers.

READY TO USE:

This heavy duty insecticide is ready to use and is recommended where fast results and maximum effectiveness are desired with use of a minimum amount of base oil.

FOGGING INSTRUCTIONS

FLYING INSECTS:

Flies, fruit flies, gnats, flying moths and other flying insects are killed almost immediately on contact. Use at the rate of 1 oz. per 2000 cu. ft. of space. Cover foodstuffs to prevent contamination from falling insects. For best results close area to be treated and keep closed for ten minutes.

CRAWLING INSECTS:

The active ingredients in this formula are also present in sufficient concentration to kill on contact the exposed (or accessible) stages of the granary weevil, rice weevil, confused flour beetle, rust red flour beetle, cadell, saw toothed grain beetle, spider beetle, angoumois grain moth, Mediterranean flour moth, meal worm, cigarette beetle, drug store beetle, cheese skipper, cheese mite and grain mite.

For best results spray thoroughly at a rate of 1 gallon per 750 square feet of surface with a hand or pressure type sprayer into cracks and crevices and other places where insects may be harbored in order to contact as many as possible. Follow at once with a fogging of area. Use at the rate of 1 oz. per 1000 cu. ft. of space. Leave area closed up for two or more hours afterwards for best results.

Do not fog in presence of open fire or flame. Combustible liquid, do not use, spill, pour or store near heat or open flame.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in manner inconsistent with it's labeling.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohibited. STORAGE: If container is damaged: Stop any leaks by repositioning the container or by patching or otherwise repairing the leaks. Take care to avoid contact with pesticide and wear protective gear. On cleanup of spilled liquids, wear protective equipment as required as to prevent contact with the product or its vapors. Cover the spilled areas with generous amounts of absorbent material, such as clay, diatomaceous earth, sand or sawdust. Sweep the contaminated absorbent on to a shovel and put the sweepings into a salvage drum. Dispose of wastes as below. Place any leaking container into a similar drum or glass container. Do not store, use, pour or spill near heat or open flame.
