Directly below the FIFRA required statement "It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling", and beginning on a separate line, replace all text with following statements: <p align="center">READ AND FOLLOW ALL DIRECTIONS AND PRECAUTIONS ON THIS PRODUCT LABEL.</p> <p>For Outdoor Use Only. Never use repellents over cuts, wounds, sunburned or irritated skin. Do not spray near eyes and mouth, and apply sparingly around ears. Do not spray directly into face. If used on the face, spray on hands first and then apply sparingly to face and do not get into eyes. Do not allow children to handle this product. Do not apply to children's hands. When using on children, apply to your own hands and then put it on the child. Apply only to exposed skin and/or clothing (as directed below). Do not use under clothing. Do not spray in enclosed areas. Do not breathe spray and do not use it near food. Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Heavy application and saturation is unnecessary for effectiveness; if biting insects do not respond to a thin film of repellent, apply a bit more. After returning indoors, wash</p>

To be eligible for reregistration, aerosol spray formulations must be packaged in containers utilizing a concave trigger to help aim product or other comparable mechanism that will ensure that the product will not be inadvertently sprayed in the eyes.



The Agency intends to defer the determination of any related efficacy data requirements supporting the claims that may appear on this label until these Efficacy Assessment Guidelines are complete. When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.

Do not apply to skin under clothing. Wash treated skin with soap and water after returning indoors.
