The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable subject to the comments listed below. Five copies of the finished labeling must be submitted prior to releasing the products for shipment.

- 1) Remove the phrase "apply liberally" wherever it is shown on the label. This phrase is inconsistent with the DEET Label Improvement Program.
- 2) Add to the directions for use the phrase as shown in PR Notice 91-4, "Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Do not use under clothing. Avoid overexposure."
- 3) Add to either the directions for use or the Hazard to Humans and Domestic Animals section the phrase "Use of this product may cause skin reactions in rare cases. If you suspect that you or your child is reacting to this product, wash treated skin and get medical attention."

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION

For external use only. Do not get in eyes or mouth. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid breathing spray mist or using in enclosed areas. Do not apply over cuts, wounds, irritated or excessively sunburned skin. Do not spray directly on face.

To repel the insects listed on the front panel, apply to all exposed skin surfaces. Slightly moisten skin or clothing with a slow sweeping motion. Frequent reapplication and saturation is unnecessary. Apply to face by first spraying small amounts in palm of hand and spreading on face and neck. Do not apply to the hands of young children. Do not apply on skin under clothing. Wash treated skin after returning indoors. For ticks and chiggers, also apply liberally to shoe tops, socks, and around openings in clothing. Wash treated clothing after use.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE - Store in a cool dry area away from heat and open flame.

DISPOSAL - Do not reuse empty container. Do not puncture or incinerate. Replace cap and wrap empty container in newspaper and put in trash collection.
