**PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS
HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS**

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

1. Adjust water pH to 7.2 - 7.6. For pools with copper plumbing best pH factor is 7.5 - 7.8.
2. If the pool has not been previously stabilized with conditioner and stabilizer (cyanuric acid) add correct dosage. Follow the directions for use on the label for that product.
3. Dose using the method below best suited for your particular pool.

INITIAL DOSE: Add three tablets for every 7,500 gallons of pool water. Each tablet weighs 48 grams. This should be sufficient to satisfy demand of raw water in establishing a chlorine residual. If there is no chlorine residual on the following day repeat dosage until chlorine residual of 1 ppm - 1.5 ppm is found 24 hours later prior to any scheduled dosages. Test water frequently with a reliable test kit.

MAINTENANCE DOSE: Thereafter, feed one tablet per 7,500 gallons daily or as needed to maintain a minimum chlorine residual of 1.0 ppm to 1.5 ppm as determined by a test kit. During heat waves or periods of heavy bathing load, more tablets will be required per day to maintain chlorine residual. Also check pH to keep in proper range, as pH has a direct effect on chlorine action. These tablets reduce the need for addition of chemicals to adjust pH, but pH should be brought back into range if it falls or climbs due to rain, makeup water, wind blown dust, or any other reason.

Application should be made using one of the following methods:

FLOATING CHLORINATOR: An appropriate floating chlorinator is one that is designed for quick dissolving tablets. Follow the manufacturer's directions for use.

SKIMMER METHOD: Empty skimmer of all chemicals and/or debris. Make sure the filter is on and that water is properly recirculating through skimmer. Remove any chemicals that may be in an in-line automatic chemical dispensing device. Place tablets in skimmer, they will dissolve in approximately 15 minutes.

POOL GALLON CALCULATOR (all dimensions in feet)

Square or Rectangular: Length x Width x Average Depth x 7.5 = Gallons

Round or Oval: Length x Width x Average Depth x 5.9 = Gallons

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Keep product dry in a tightly closed container when not in use. Store in a cool, dry, well ventilated area away from heat or open flame. In case of decomposition isolate container in open area if possible and flood with large amounts of water. Do not reuse empty container. Rinse empty container thoroughly with water to dissolve all material before discarding. Place in trash collection or dispose in approved landfill area.
