No. 7138-VA-1 Page 2 of 6 pages To prevent goosegrass, crabgrass, foxtail, barnyard grass, fall panicum, Oxalis, Knotweed, Prostrate Spurge, apply in the spring before they sprout. To prevent Poa Annua and fall germinating chickweed, apply product to dry foliage in late summer or early fall before weed seeds germinate.

#### FOR ESTABLISHED TURF

When applied prior to germination of weeds this product will control weed as listed in Northern and Southern turf grasses. Use lower rates for turfgrass in annual maintenance. Apply the higher rates for turfgrass being treated the first time, and also for turf areas known, to be heavily infested with weeds and under heavy weed pressure.

#### NORTHERN COOL SEASON GRASSES

For Bluegrass varieties, Perennial Ryegrass, Fine Fescue, Tall Fescue, Bentgrass and Poa Annua (except putting greens and tees). Apply 7 to 14 days before expected time of weed seed germination at the rate of 2.70 to 4.72 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. (equiv. to 1.0 to 1.75 lbs. a.i. Pendimethalin per acre).

#### SOUTHERN WARM SEASON GRASSES

For Bermudagrass (non "winter-overseeded"), St. Augustinegrass, Bahiagrass, Zoysiagrass, Centipedegrass and blends of these grasses. Apply 2.70 to 5.40 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. equiv. to 1.0 to 2.0 lbs. of a.i. Pendimethalin per acre, prior to germination of weed seeds. Where light weed infestations are expected, the lower rates may be used. For extended weed control, a repeat application is recommended. For best results, water after all application (1/4 to ½ inch) to remove the granules from the foliage and to move the product to the soil surface for an effective chemical herbicide barrier. Do not destroy the herbicide barrier created at the soil surface by raking or aerifying the turf after applying this product.

#### PRECAUTIONS IN USING

Do not use on Bentgrass and Poa Annua putting greens and tees, or on dichondra. Where Bentgrass and Bentgrass-containing turf and Poa Annua are the desired species, a lower rate application only is recommended.

On Cool Season Turfgrasses avoid applications when temperatures are regularly in the 80's. This product may cause discoloration and thinning where over applications have been made if the turfgrass is under severe stress conditions (disease, drought, low temperatures-below 40°F, scalping, and excessive soil moisture).

#### BERMUDAGRASS, BENTGRASS, AND POA ANNUA PRECAUTIONS

Do not apply to dormant Bermudagrass, Bentgrass or Poa Annua (turf that is not growing actively or has frost injury). May be applied to dormant Bermudagrass if it has been maintained at ½ inch or more high cut and is growing in medium fine textured soils such as clays and clay loams. When applied to dormant Bermudagrass, greening up may be delayed 2 to 3 weeks in the spring. The delay in this greening process may be more noticeable on low cut Bermudagrass on sandy soils. Where turf thinning or damage has occurred due to winter injury of Bermudgrass do not make an application until turf has greened up, is growing vigorously, and has filled in the dead areas. Application to Bermudagrass overseeded with a cool season grass may injure and thin the overseeded variety. Do not apply to Bentgrass or Poa Annua after late summer.

#### **OTHER PRECAUTIONS**

For Seeding; For newly planted areas; Removal of product from sidewalks etc. Delay seeding 4 months and sprigging by 5 months after an application. For best results, the soil surface should be worked (verticut and/or etc.) to destroy any remaining chemical residue before planting. For newly planted areas, wait until the turf has been mowed up to 4 times, and is growing vigorously before application. Do not apply to the same area more than twice in one year. Avoid application to cement, stone, clothing or shoes. If contact occurs, brush off particles to prevent yellow staining. If necessary, rinse with water. If metallic surfaces (golf course equipment, automobiles, etc.) are present at the application site, do not use this product under windy conditions (5 to 10 miles per hour) due to its yellow staining potential.
