The amendment (label update and revised CSF-dated October 27, 1994) referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided that you:

1. Make the following labeling changes below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling.

a. Revise the referral statement to read: See back panel for additional precautionary statements.

b. Delete the word: First Aid.

c. Include the following additional subheadings:

Container Disposal
Pesticide Disposal

Add these heading to the Storage and Disposal section.

d. Add the following to the front panel:

A Swimming Pool Algaecide

e. The headings: Active Ingredients and Inert Ingredients must be of same type size.

2. A release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

3. A stamped copy of the labeling is enclosed for your records.

4. Our records have been adjusted to reflect your product name change:

OLD PRODUCT NAME: Sea/Gard Pool Water Winterizer

NEW PRODUCT NAME: Seaboard Sea/Gard The Winter Chemical

5. The submitted Confidential Statement of Formula (dated October 27, 1994) is acceptable. Note also that this confidential will supersede all previous confidentials.

However note for future reference that the upper certified limit for the Quat (Block 14a) should be around 2.4225% and the lower certified limit for the Quat (Block 14b) should be around 2.6775% for this product.

6. It has been noted for the record also that your Confidential Statement of Formula declares that Textile Chemical is a distributor of a product from Phelps Dodge Refinery. A check of our files at EPA, doesn't reflect this distributor arrangement. It would be in your interest as well as Phelps Dodge and Textile to rectify this situation asap.

7. It has also been noted that currently "RegNet" is not an authorized agent of record therefore this letter will only be sent to your attention.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

1. Adjust pool water pH to 7.2 to 7.6
2. Chlorinate the pool water to 1.5 ppm of available chlorine.
3. Clean the pool before using this product.
4. Add Seaboard SEA/GARD at a rate of one half gallon for every 40,000 gallons of water, distributed around the perimeter of pool.
5. Cover the pool after the use of product.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Keep container closed when not in use. Leaking or damaged containers should be placed in a plastic bag and discarded in trash. Mop up spills with clean water. Do not reuse empty container. Securely wrap in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.
