1. Bold **“If swallowed:”, “If on skin or clothing:”, “If inhaled:”, “If in eyes:”, “Note to Physician or Veterinarian:”** to make the text much easier to find in the event of a poisoning of a highly toxic product. Earlier versions of your label contained such bolding.
2. In the **“Note to Physician or Veterinarian:”**, change “lowered prothrombin times” to “elevated prothrombin times”.
3. Change “Exposure to this product during pregnancy should be avoided.” to “Avoid exposure to this product during pregnancy.”; followed by “Repeated exposure to small amounts of this product can cause cumulative toxicity. Check prothrombin times of persons at risk periodically.”.
4. Revise your use directions as follows:

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Only for formulation into a rodenticide for

- i. the following uses: in and around buildings, inside transport vehicles, in sewers (Norway rat, roof rat, and house mouse) and in pome fruits, stone fruits, nurseries, forestry plantations, rangeland, and selected non-crop sites and;
- ii. uses for which USEPA has accepted the required data and/or citation of data that the formulator has submitted in support of registration; and
- iii. Experimental Use Permits that are in compliance with the requirements of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Formulators using this product are responsible for obtaining EPA registration for their formulated product.

5. Follow Enclosure 2, “Minimum Type Sizes for Final Printed Label”. Also, “Skull and Crossbones” and “POISON” must in red text.
6. Under **“STORAGE AND DISPOSAL”**, revise the text for **“Pesticide Disposal”** to that approved on the February 7, 1996, which reflects the correct text for a Category 1 product:

Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

7. Under “**STORAGE AND DISPOSAL**”, revise “**Container Disposal**” to “**Container Handling**” followed by instructions for each type of container. In general, you will be adding the new text required by the “Container Regulations” (40 CFR 156.140 – .159) and explained in PRN 2007-4 to the existing container disposal instructions. Contact us if you need assistance in developing correct text. Also, all products distributed or sold in nonrefillable containers will need batch codes on the label or the container.

The acceptable Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF) for this product is dated October 5, 2007. All other versions are obsolete.

Stocks of product with existing labels may be used for eighteen (18) months.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

FIRST AID

Have this label with you when obtaining treatment advice.

For humans or dogs that have ingested this product, or have obvious poisoning symptoms (bleeding) or lowered prothrombin times, give Vitamin K₁ by intramuscular or oral administration. In severe cases, blood transfusions may be necessary. Check prothrombin time every 3 days until values return to normal.
